- *Readily noticed.*



Synonyms of "Noticeable" as an adjective (17 Words)

appreciable	Enough to be estimated or measured. <i>Appreciable amounts of noxious wastes are dumped into the harbor.</i>
detectable	Capable of being detected. <i>The virus is not yet detectable in the blood.</i>
discernible	Capable of being seen or noticed. <i>The newspaper reports no discernible progress in the negotiations.</i>
<u>distinguishable</u>	Capable of being perceived as different or distinct. <i>This particular case is distinguishable from others.</i>
interesting	Arousing curiosity or interest; holding or catching the attention. <i>It will be very interesting to see what they come up with.</i>
measurable	Of distinguished importance. <i>Measurable depths.</i>

notable	Worthy of notice. <i>A notable historian.</i>
observable	Capable of being seen or noticed. <i>An observable change in behavior.</i>
of particular interest	First and most important.
perceivable	Capable of being perceived especially by sight or hearing. <i>Perceivable through the mist.</i>
perceptible	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>A perceptible decline in public confidence.</i>
<u>recognizable</u>	Capable of being recognized. <i>There was no recognizable photograph of him.</i>
significant	Rich in significance or implication. <i>A significant change in the Constitution.</i>
<u>visible</u>	Able to be perceived or noticed easily. <i>The visible spectrum.</i>
worth taking a look at	Worthy of being treated in a particular way (often used ironically).
worthy of mention	Having worth or merit or value; being honorable or admirable.
worthy of note	Having qualities or abilities that merit recognition in some way.



Usage Examples of "Noticeable" as an adjective

- *Noticeable shadows under her eyes.*
- *Noticeable grey hairs.*
- *Noticeable for its vivid historical background.*
- *A noticeable lack of friendliness.*
- *The church is noticeable for the fresco above the door.*
- *A noticeable increase in staff motivation.*
- *After a noticeable pause the lecturer continued.*

apparent

Clearly visible or understood; obvious.

For all his **apparent** wealth he had no money to pay the rent.

appreciable

Enough to be estimated or measured.

Appreciable amounts of noxious wastes are dumped into the harbor.

conspicuous

Without any attempt at concealment; completely obvious.

Made herself **conspicuous** by her exhibitionistic preening.

conspicuously

In a clearly visible way.

His arguments **conspicuously** lack rigour.

detectable

Easily seen or detected.

Yvette responded finally her French accent barely **detectable**.

discernible

Able to be discerned; perceptible.

The newspaper reports no **discernible** progress in the negotiations.

distinctly	In a distinct and distinguishable manner. <i>He looked distinctly uncomfortable.</i>
evident	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>She ate the biscuits with evident enjoyment.</i>
identifiable	Capable of being identified. <i>There are no easily identifiable features on the shoreline.</i>
intelligible	Able to be understood only by the intellect, not by the senses. <i>A barely intelligible reply.</i>
manifest	Record in a ship's manifest. <i>Bad industrial relations are often manifested in strikes.</i>
marked	Strongly marked; easily noticeable. <i>A marked increase in UK sales.</i>
noteworthy	Worthy of attention because interesting, significant, or unusual. <i>A noteworthy advance in cancer research.</i>
observable	Capable of being seen or noticed. <i>Observable differences.</i>
obtrusive	Undesirably noticeable. <i>A large and obtrusive works where ammonia is produced.</i>
obvious	Easily perceived or understood; clear, self-evident, or apparent. <i>Unemployment has been the most obvious cost of the recession.</i>
palpability	The quality of being perceivable by touch.
palpable	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>A palpable lie.</i>
perceptible	Easily seen or detected. <i>A perceptible decline in public confidence.</i>
preeminent	Greatest in importance or degree or significance or achievement. <i>A preeminent archeologist.</i>
prominent	Important; famous. <i>A man with big prominent eyes like a lobster's.</i>
pronounced	Strongly marked; easily noticeable. <i>A pronounced flavor of cinnamon.</i>
recognizable	Capable of being recognized. <i>His car was instantly recognizable.</i>
sensible	(of an object) practical and functional rather than decorative. <i>The sensible universe.</i>
striking	The action of striking. <i>She is naturally striking.</i>

substantial

Having substance or capable of being treated as fact; not imaginary.
*Spirits are shadowy human beings **substantial**.*

tangibility

The quality of being perceivable by touch.

tangible

(of especially business assets) having physical substance and intrinsic monetary value.

*These are the only **tangibles** upon which an assessment can be made.*

visible

Visible imports or exports.

*The church spire is **visible** from miles away.*

visibly

So as to be visible.

*The defendant paled **visibly** as the guilty verdict was announced.*
