<b>appreciable</b>	Enough to be estimated or measured. <i><b>Appreciable</b> amounts of noxious wastes are dumped into the harbor.</i>
<b>detectable</b>	Capable of being detected. <i>The virus is not yet <b>detectable</b> in the blood.</i>
<b>discernible</b>	Capable of being seen or noticed. <i>The newspaper reports no <b>discernible</b> progress in the negotiations.</i>
<b><u>distinguishable</u></b>	Capable of being perceived as different or distinct. <i>This particular case is <b>distinguishable</b> from others.</i>
<b>interesting</b>	Arousing curiosity or interest; holding or catching the attention. <i>It will be very <b>interesting</b> to see what they come up with.</i>
<b>measurable</b>	Of distinguished importance. <i><b>Measurable</b> depths.</i>

<b>notable</b>	Worthy of notice. <i>A <b>notable</b> historian.</i>
<b>observable</b>	Capable of being seen or noticed. <i>An <b>observable</b> change in behavior.</i>
<b>of particular interest</b>	First and most important.
<b>perceivable</b>	Capable of being perceived especially by sight or hearing. <i><b>Perceivable</b> through the mist.</i>
<b>perceptible</b>	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>A <b>perceptible</b> decline in public confidence.</i>
<b><u>recognizable</u></b>	Capable of being recognized. <i>There was no <b>recognizable</b> photograph of him.</i>
<b>significant</b>	Rich in significance or implication. <i>A <b>significant</b> change in the Constitution.</i>
<b><u>visible</u></b>	Able to be perceived or noticed easily. <i>The <b>visible</b> spectrum.</i>
<b>worth taking a look at</b>	Worthy of being treated in a particular way (often used ironically).
<b>worthy of mention</b>	Having worth or merit or value; being honorable or admirable.
<b>worthy of note</b>	Having qualities or abilities that merit recognition in some way.

- *Noticeable for its vivid historical background.*
- *A noticeable lack of friendliness.*
- *The church is noticeable for the fresco above the door.*

*For all his **apparent** wealth he had no money to pay the rent.*
- appreciable** Enough to be estimated or measured.  
***Appreciable** amounts of noxious wastes are dumped into the harbor.*
- conspicuous** Without any attempt at concealment; completely obvious.  
*Made herself **conspicuous** by her exhibitionistic preening.*
- conspicuously** In a clearly visible way.  
*His arguments **conspicuously** lack rigour.*
- detectable** Easily seen or detected.  
*Yvette responded finally her French accent barely **detectable**.*
- discernible** Able to be discerned; perceptible.  
*The newspaper reports no **discernible** progress in the negotiations.*

<b>distinctly</b>	In a distinct and distinguishable manner. <i>He looked <b>distinctly</b> uncomfortable.</i>
<b><u>evident</u></b>	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>She ate the biscuits with <b>evident</b> enjoyment.</i>
<b>identifiable</b>	Capable of being identified. <i>There are no easily <b>identifiable</b> features on the shoreline.</i>
<b>intelligible</b>	Able to be understood only by the intellect, not by the senses. <i>A barely <b>intelligible</b> reply.</i>
<b><u>manifest</u></b>	Record in a ship's manifest. <i>Bad industrial relations are often <b>manifested</b> in strikes.</i>
<b>marked</b>	Strongly marked; easily noticeable. <i>A <b>marked</b> increase in UK sales.</i>
<b>noteworthy</b>	Worthy of attention because interesting, significant, or unusual. <i>A <b>noteworthy</b> advance in cancer research.</i>
<b>observable</b>	Capable of being seen or noticed. <i><b>Observable</b> differences.</i>
<b>obtrusive</b>	Undesirably noticeable. <i>A large and <b>obtrusive</b> works where ammonia is produced.</i>
<b>obvious</b>	Easily perceived or understood; clear, self-evident, or apparent. <i>Unemployment has been the most <b>obvious</b> cost of the recession.</i>
<b>palpability</b>	The quality of being perceivable by touch.
<b><u>palpable</u></b>	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>A <b>palpable</b> lie.</i>
<b>perceptible</b>	Easily seen or detected. <i>A <b>perceptible</b> decline in public confidence.</i>
<b><u>preeminent</u></b>	Greatest in importance or degree or significance or achievement. <i>A <b>preeminent</b> archeologist.</i>
<b>prominent</b>	Important; famous. <i>A man with big <b>prominent</b> eyes like a lobster's.</i>
<b>pronounced</b>	Strongly marked; easily noticeable. <i>A <b>pronounced</b> flavor of cinnamon.</i>
<b><u>recognizable</u></b>	Capable of being recognized. <i>His car was instantly <b>recognizable</b>.</i>
<b>sensible</b>	(of an object) practical and functional rather than decorative. <i>The <b>sensible</b> universe.</i>
<b><u>striking</u></b>	The action of striking. <i>She is naturally <b>striking</b>.</i>

- substantial** Having substance or capable of being treated as fact; not imaginary.  
*Spirits are shadowy human beings **substantial**.*
- tangibility** The quality of being perceivable by touch.
- tangible** (of especially business assets) having physical substance and intrinsic monetary value.  
*These are the only **tangibles** upon which an assessment can be made.*
- visible** Visible imports or exports.  
*The church spire is **visible** from miles away.*
- visibly** So as to be visible.  
*The defendant paled **visibly** as the guilty verdict was announced.*
