<b>gaud</b>	Cheap showy jewelry or ornament on clothing. <i>Displays of overpriced <b>gauds</b>.</i>
<b>gewgaw</b>	A showy thing, especially one that is useless or worthless. <i>A house full of Victorian <b>gewgaws</b>.</i>
<b>gimcrack</b>	Ornamental objects of no great value.
<b>imaginativeness</b>	The formation of a mental image of something that is not perceived as real and is not present to the senses.
<b>innovation</b>	A creation (a new device or process) resulting from study and experimentation. <i><b>Innovation</b> is crucial to the continuing success of any organization.</i>
<b>innovativeness</b>	Originality by virtue of introducing new ideas.
<b>knickknack</b>	Miscellaneous curios.
<b>modernity</b>	The quality of being current or of the present. <i>Hobbes was the genius of <b>modernity</b>.</i>
<b>modernness</b>	The quality of being current or of the present.
<b><u>newness</u></b>	The quality of being new; the opposite of oldness. <i>The shiny <b>newness</b> of the giant conference centre.</i>
<b><u>originality</u></b>	The ability to think independently and creatively. <i>He congratulated her on the <b>originality</b> of her costume.</i>
<b>ornament</b>	A quality or person adding grace, beauty, or honour to something. <i>Sense of humour is an <b>ornament</b> to character.</i>
<b><u>toy</u></b>	Any of several breeds of very small dogs kept purely as pets. <i>A <b>toy</b> car.</i>
<b>trifle</b>	Something of small importance. <i>Bowls of <b>trifle</b> followed.</i>
<b><u>trinket</u></b>	A small ornament or item of jewellery that is of little value.
<b>unconventionality</b>	Unorthodoxy by virtue of being unconventional.
<b><u>unfamiliarity</u></b>	The quality of not being known or recognized. <i>Counterfeiters exploited people s <b>unfamiliarity</b> with the currency.</i>
<b>unusualness</b>	Uncommonness by virtue of being unusual.

<b><u>imaginative</u></b>	(used of persons or artifacts) marked by independence and creativity in thought or action. <i>Making <b>imaginative</b> use of computer software.</i>
<b>ingenious</b>	(of a machine or idea) cleverly and originally devised and well suited to its purpose. <i>An <b>ingenious</b> solution to the problem.</i>
<b>ingenuity</b>	The property of being ingenious. <i>The <b>ingenuity</b> of Haydn's scoring.</i>
<b>innovation</b>	The action or process of innovating. <i><b>Innovation</b> is crucial to the continuing success of any organization.</i>
<b>innovative</b>	Ahead of the times. <i>Writers who are now viewed as <b>innovative</b>.</i>
