#### Synonyms of "Nullify" as a verb (14 Words)

annul	Cancel officially. The contract was <b>annul</b> led.
avoid	Refrain from doing something. This route <b>avoid</b> s downtown Boston.
cancel out	Declare null and void; make ineffective.
declare null and void	Designate (a trump suit or no-trump) with the final bid of a hand.



<u>invalidate</u>	Take away the legal force of or render ineffective. A technical flaw in her papers <b>invalidate</b> d her nomination.
make of no use or value	Earn on some commercial or business transaction; earn as salary or wages.
negate	Make ineffective by counterbalancing the effect of. This action will <b>negate</b> the effect of my efforts.
neutralise	Make ineffective by counterbalancing the effect of.
<u>neutralize</u>	Make (an acidic or alkaline substance) chemically neutral. Impatience at his frailty began to <b>neutralize</b> her fear.
quash	Put down by force or intimidation. <i>His conviction was <b>quash</b>ed on appeal.</i>
render ineffective	Give an interpretation or rendition of.
render invalid	Give or supply.
render null and void	Coat with plastic or cement.
<u>void</u>	Declare invalid. The concert hall was <b>void</b> ed of the audience.

### Usage Examples of "Nullify" as a verb

- Insulin can block the release of the hormone and thereby nullify the effects of training.
- Judges were unwilling to nullify government decisions.

abnegation	Self-denial. Abnegation of political power.
abolish	Do away with. Slavery was <b>abolish</b> ed in the mid 19th century in America and in Russia.
abrogate	Evade (a responsibility or duty. A proposal to <b>abrogate</b> temporarily the right to strike.
abrogation	The repeal or abolition of a law, right, or agreement.
<u>annihilate</u>	Kill in large numbers. The stronger force <b>annihilate</b> d its opponent virtually without loss.
annul	Declare invalid. Her first marriage was finally <b>annul</b> led by His Holiness.
<u>belie</u>	(of an appearance) fail to give a true impression of (something. <i>His lively alert manner <b>belie</b>d his years.</i>

Be in contradiction with. The survey appears to <b>contradict</b> the industry s claims.
Equality of distribution. The sitter s weight <b>counterbalance</b> s the tilting pressure on the backrest.
Deny formally an allegation of fact by the opposing party in a legal suit. The servants are ordered to <b>deny</b> him.
Refuse to acknowledge; disclaim knowledge of; responsibility for, or association with. The union leaders resisted pressure to <b>disavow</b> picket line violence.
Destroy completely, as if down to the roots. They use poison to <b>exterminate</b> moles.
Make invalid for use. A technical flaw in her papers <b>invalidate</b> d her nomination.
Deny the existence of. Alcohol <b>negate</b> s the effects of the drug.
Make ineffective by counterbalancing the effect of. <i>Her optimism <b>neutralize</b>s his gloom.</i>
Prevail over. Health considerations <b>override</b> financial concerns.
A deliberate discourteous act (usually as an expression of anger or disapproval. <i>Callers phoning a chatline need have no fear of</i> <b>rebuff</b> .
An expression of unwillingness to accept or grant an offer or request. Dollar Girl hit several fences and had a <b>refusal</b> .
The person or thing that is rejected or set aside as inferior in quality. An application to hold a pop concert at the club was <b>reject</b> ed.
The speech act of rejecting. His proposals were met with <b>rejection</b> .
The formal rejection of something, typically a belief, claim, or course of action. A <b>renunciation</b> of violence.
Cancel officially. The legislation was <b>repeal</b> ed five months later.
Reject as untrue, unfounded, or unjust. She has <b>repudiate</b> d policies associated with previous party leaders.



repudiation	Refusal to fulfil or discharge an agreement, obligation, or debt. A <b>repudiation</b> of left wing political ideas.
rescind	Cancel officially. The government eventually <b>rescind</b> ed the directive.
rescission	<ul> <li>(law) the act of rescinding; the cancellation of a contract and the return of the parties to the positions they would have had if the contract had not been made.</li> <li>The plaintiff agreed to the <b>rescission</b> of the agreement.</li> </ul>
revocable	Capable of being revoked or annulled. A <b>revocable</b> settlement.
<u>revoke</u>	Cancel officially. He <b>revoke</b> d the ban on smoking.
<u>veto</u>	A rejection by right of veto. I <b>veto</b> ed the idea of a holiday.
