

## Numb as an Adjective

#### Definitions of "Numb" as an adjective

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "numb" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Unable to think, feel, or respond normally.
- Not showing human feeling or sensitivity; unresponsive.
- Lacking sensation.
- (of a part of the body) deprived of the power of physical sensation.
- So frightened as to be unable to move; stunned or paralyzed with terror; petrified.
- (followed by `to') not showing human feeling or sensitivity; unresponsive.
