adorned	Provided with something intended to increase its beauty or distinction.
<u>anniversary</u>	The date on which a romance began in a previous month or week. <i>The 50th anniversary of the Battle of Britain.</i>
banquet	Provide a feast or banquet for. <i>A banquet for the graduating seniors.</i>
bedeck	Decorate. <i>He led us into a room bedecked with tinsel.</i>
benediction	A ceremonial prayer invoking divine protection. <i>He said the benediction.</i>
betroth	Formally engage (someone) to be married. <i>In no time I shall be betrothed to Isabel.</i>
betrothal	A mutual promise to marry.
<u>bouquet</u>	A pleasingly sweet olfactory property. <i>The aperitif has a faint bouquet of almonds.</i>
bridal	Of or pertaining to a bride. <i>Her white bridal gown.</i>
<u>bride</u>	A woman on her wedding day or just before and after the event. <i>The bride and groom left early last night.</i>
bridegroom	A man participant in his own marriage ceremony.
ceremony	A formal religious or public occasion, especially one celebrating a particular event, achievement, or anniversary. <i>The winners were presented with their prizes at a special ceremony.</i>
consummate	Make (a marriage or relationship) complete by having sexual intercourse. <i>They did not consummate their marriage until months after it took place.</i>
<u>diamond</u>	A transparent piece of diamond that has been cut and polished and is valued as a precious gem. <i>She led a losing diamond.</i>
dowry	Money or property brought by a woman to her husband at marriage. <i>Elizabeth s dowry was to be 45 000 in diamonds.</i>
engagement	A mutual promise to marry. <i>A good long engagement to give you time to be sure.</i>
<u>feast</u>	Partake in a feast or banquet. <i>A wedding feast.</i>
<u>groom</u>	A bridegroom. <i>He is grooming his son to become his successor.</i>

headdress	Clothing for the head. <i>A veil held in place with a pearl headdress.</i>
honeymoon	Spend a honeymoon. <i>They flew to the West Indies on honeymoon.</i>
<u>jewelry</u>	An adornment (as a bracelet or ring or necklace) made of precious metals and set with gems (or imitation gems).
marital	Relating to marriage or the relations between a married couple. <i>Marital status.</i>
marriage	The state of being married. <i>A long and happy marriage.</i>
married	A person who is married. <i>A married man.</i>
marry	Blend or combine with something. <i>They had no plans to marry.</i>
newlywed	Someone recently married.
preen	Congratulate or pride oneself. <i>Reed buntings preened at the pool's edge.</i>
troth	Faith or loyalty when pledged in a solemn agreement or undertaking. <i>A token of troth.</i>
<u>veil</u>	Cover with a veil. <i>The development of these technologies has been veiled in secrecy.</i>
wedding	A party of people at a wedding.
