| adoption | The appropriation (of ideas or words etc) from another source. <i>Its adoption by society.</i> |
| beget | Make (offspring) by reproduction. <i>They hoped that the King might beget an heir by his new queen.</i> |
| breed | Cause (an animal) to produce offspring, especially in a controlled and organized way. <i>Pandas rarely breed in captivity.</i> |
| breeding | The production of animals or plants by inbreeding or hybridization. <i>A woman of breeding and refinement.</i> |
| child | An immature childish person. <i>The children of Israel.</i> |
| elevate | (of a priest) hold up (a consecrated host or chalice) for adoration. <i>She ordered the bishop celebrating Mass in her chapel not to elevate the Host.</i> |
| elevation | (ballet) the height of a dancer's leap or jump. <i>As every gunner knows increasing the elevation beyond five degrees can be a risky business.</i> |
| engender | Make (offspring) by reproduction. <i>The issue engendered continuing controversy.</i> |
| foster | Bring up under fosterage of children. <i>When fostering out a child placement workers will be looking for a home similar to their own.</i> |
| hackles | A feeling of anger and animosity. <i>Having one s hackles or dander up.</i> |
| hoist | An act of raising or lifting something. <i>She hoisted her backpack on to her shoulder.</i> |
| housework | Regular work done in housekeeping, especially cleaning and tidying. <i>I was busy doing housework when the doorbell rang.</i> |

| hybrid | Bred as a hybrid from different species or varieties. <i>Jungle is a hybrid of reggae and house music.</i> |
| increasing | Music increasing in tempo and or volume. <i>Increasing prices.</i> |
| institutional | Relating to or constituting or involving an institution. <i>Institutional religion.</i> |
| mongrel | A person of mixed descent. <i>She s a particularly intelligent mongrel with a lot of collie in her.</i> |
| mounting | The action of mounting something. <i>He pulled the curtain rail from its mounting.</i> |
| overindulgence | Excessive gratification of a person's wishes. <i>The child was spoiled by overindulgence.</i> |
| <u>parent</u> | Be or act as a parent to a child. <i>Stems will root down creating a new crown near the parent.</i> |
| pregnant | (of a woman or female animal) having a child or young developing in the uterus. <i>A silence pregnant with suspense.</i> |
| produce | Agricultural and other natural products collectively. <i>The plant produces blue flowers in late autumn.</i> |
| propagation | The act of producing offspring or multiplying by such production. <i>The physics of light propagation.</i> |
| raise | Raise in rank or condition. <i>Raise a mutiny.</i> |
| raising | Helping someone grow up to be an accepted member of the community. <i>A raising of the land resulting from volcanic activity.</i> |
| rearing | Rearing on left hind leg with forelegs elevated and head usually in profile. |
| <u>reproduction</u> | A copy of a work of art, especially a print or photograph of a painting. <i>Toads converge upon lakes and ponds intent on reproduction.</i> |
| skyrocket | (of a price, rate, or amount) increase very steeply or rapidly. <i>The cost of the welfare system has skyrocketed.</i> |
| spawn | The process of producing spawn. <i>A supplier of spawn for shiitake mushrooms.</i> |
| <u>upbringing</u> | Properties acquired during a person's formative years. <i>He was a countryman by upbringing.</i> |
| <u>uplift</u> | Lift up from the earth, as by geologic forces. <i>To get our whole group back together should be a big emotional uplift for the team.</i> |
