acquiescent Willing to carry out the orders or wishes of another without protest.

allegiant Steadfast in devotion (especially to your lawful monarch or government.

A gentle old horse **docile** and obedient.

Willingly obedient out of a sense of duty and respect. dutiful

A dutiful child.

Make (someone) a slave. enslave

They were **enslave**d by their need to take drugs.

A servant employed to do a variety of jobs. factotum

He was employed as the general **factotum**.

Abjectly submissive characteristic of a slave or servant S H Adams.

submissive Replacing troublemakers with more **submissive** people.



subservience Abject or cringing submissiveness. *Blind subservience to authority.*

Abjectly submissive; characteristic of a slave or servant. **subservient**

She has become submissive and **subservient**.

Make less strong or intense; soften. tame

Wild rabbits can be kept in captivity and eventually tamed.

tractability The trait of being easily persuaded.

Readily reacting to suggestions and influences. **tractable**

She has always been **tractable** and obedient even as a child.

The act of making a choice. <u>willing</u>

He was quite willing to compromise.
