## Synonyms of "Obese" as an adjective (18 Words)

<b>broad in the beam</b>	Not detailed or specific.
<b><u>chubby</u></b>	Sufficiently fat so as to have a pleasing fullness of figure. <i>A <b>chubby</b> child.</i>
<b>dumpy</b>	Resembling a garbage dump. <i>A <b>dumpy</b> little dumpling of a woman.</i>
<b>falstaffian</b>	Of or resembling Falstaff.
<b>flabby</b>	(of a part of a person's body) soft, loose, and fleshy. <i><b>Flabby</b> around the middle.</i>
<b>heavy</b>	Large and powerful especially designed for heavy loads or rough work. <i>A <b>heavy</b> smoker.</i>
<b>large</b>	Fairly large or important in effect influential. <i>A <b>large</b> family.</i>

<b>meaty</b>	Being on topic and prompting thought. <i>The tall <b>meaty</b> young man.</i>
<b>of ample proportions</b>	Fairly large.
<b>overweight</b>	Having more investment in a particular area than is normal or desirable. <i>An <b>overweight</b> lorry.</i>
<b><u>paunchy</u></b>	Having a large belly. <i>A slightly <b>paunchy</b> balding middle aged man.</i>
<b><u>plump</u></b>	Having a full rounded shape. <i>The berries were <b>plump</b> and sweet.</i>
<b>portly</b>	Of a stately or dignified appearance and manner. <i>Men are <b>portly</b> and women are stout.</i>
<b>rotund</b>	(of speech or literary style) sonorous; grandiloquent. <i>The <b>rotund</b> and reverberating phrase.</i>
<b><u>solid</u></b>	Of good quality and condition solidly built. <i>Carved out of <b>solid</b> rock.</i>
<b><u>stout</u></b>	Having rugged physical strength; inured to fatigue or hardships. <i>Men are portly and women are <b>stout</b>.</i>
<b>weighty</b>	Of great seriousness and importance. <i>A <b>weighty</b> argument.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Obese" as an adjective

- *One in ten people surveyed were obese.*
- *A hugely obese young man.*



## Associations of "Obese" (30 Words)

<b>adipose</b>	Composed of animal fat. <i><b>Adipose</b> tissue constitutes the fat of meat.</i>
<b>avaricious</b>	Having or showing an extreme greed for wealth or material gain. <i>They are <b>avaricious</b> and will do anything for money.</i>
<b>belly</b>	A pig's belly as food especially as a traded commodity. <i>His fat <b>belly</b> stuck out over his trousers.</i>
<b>blubber</b>	Cry or whine with snuffling. <i>My six pack is quickly being covered in <b>blubber</b>.</i>
<b>buxom</b>	(of a woman) plump, with a full figure and large breasts. <i>A generation ago <b>buxom</b> actresses were popular.</i>
<b>chubby</b>	Plump and rounded. <i>A <b>chubby</b> child.</i>
<b>dietary</b>	Of or relating to the diet. <i><b>Dietary</b> restrictions.</i>
<b>fat</b>	Containing much fat. <i>The hogs have been <b>fattening</b>.</i>
<b>fatten</b>	Make or become fat or fatter. <i>Irish cattle <b>fatten</b> up quickly.</i>
<b>fatty</b>	Containing or composed of fat. <i><b>Fatty</b> degeneration of the liver.</i>
<b>fleshy</b>	Of or relating to or resembling flesh. <i>Her <b>fleshy</b> arms.</i>
<b>gobble</b>	Use a large amount of (something) very quickly. <i>This small department was <b>gobbled</b> up by the Ministry of Transport.</i>
<b>heavy</b>	Large and powerful especially designed for heavy loads or rough work. <i><b>Heavy</b> taxes.</i>
<b>hypodermic</b>	A piston syringe that is fitted with a hypodermic needle for giving injections. <i>The <b>hypodermics</b> left strewn around the piazza.</i>
<b>nutritious</b>	Efficient as food; nourishing. <i>Home cooked burgers make a <b>nutritious</b> meal.</i>
<b>obesity</b>	The state of being grossly fat or overweight. <i>The problem of <b>obesity</b> among children.</i>
<b>overeat</b>	Overeat or eat immodestly make a pig of oneself. <i>If your friends <b>overeate</b> you're more likely to <b>overeate</b> too.</i>

- overweight** Having more investment in a particular area than is normal or desirable.  
*We have **overweighted** the banking sector.*
- paunch** Disembowel (an animal).  
*His body was powerful and square with the beginnings of a **paunch**.*
- paunchy** Having a large or protruding belly.  
*A slightly **paunchy** balding middle aged man.*
- plump** Make fat or plump.  
*I was running from the kitchen to the living room **plumping** the cushions and getting drinks in place.*
- portly** Euphemisms for `fat.  
*A **portly** little man with a bowler hat.*
- pudgy** Short and plump.  
*His **pudgy** fingers.*
- reducing** Any process in which electrons are added to an atom or ion as by removing oxygen or adding hydrogen always occurs accompanied by oxidation of the reducing agent.  
*A doctor supervised her **reducing**.*
- rotund** Full and rich.  
*Huge stoves held great **rotund** cauldrons.*
- stout** A kind of strong, dark beer brewed with roasted malt or barley.  
***Stout** walking boots.*
- swollen** Characteristic of false pride; having an exaggerated sense of self-importance.  
*So **swollen** by victory that he was unfit for normal duty.*
- tubby** Short and plump.  
*A small **tubby** man.*
- weight** Assign a handicap weight to a horse.  
*His opinion carries great **weight**.*
