justified	Having, done for, or marked by a good or legitimate reason. <i>The doctors were justified in treating her.</i>
legally	By law; conforming to the law. <i>The weapons were purchased legally.</i>
<u>liable</u>	Held legally responsible. Non resident trustees are liable to the basic rate of tax.
mandatory	Required by law or mandate; compulsory. <i>He did not want the guidelines to be mandatory.</i>
manumission	Release from slavery. A leading advocate of manumission .
morally	In a way that is considered right according to the code of behaviour of a particular society. People expected the government to behave morally .
<u>must</u>	Expressing insistence. Seat belts are an absolute must .
necessary	The action or item needed. A bag containing my wallet the money the necessary .
obligate	Require or compel (someone) to undertake a legal or moral duty. The money must be obligate d within 30 days.
obligatory	Required by a legal, moral, or other rule; compulsory. <i>Attendance is obligatory.</i>
require	Require as useful just or proper. We require our secretary to be on time.
required	Required by rule. The corset the garment that ensured the required female shape.
responsibility	The state or fact of having a duty to deal with something or of having control over someone. We expect individuals to take on more responsibility .
<u>responsible</u>	Being the primary cause of something and so able to be blamed or credited for it. She had risen rapidly to a high and responsible position in the civil service.
thank	Used ironically to assign blame or responsibility for something. Mac thank ed her for the meal and left.
