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Associations of "Obligated" (30 Words)

accountability	Responsibility to someone or for some activity. <i>Lack of accountability has corroded public respect for business and political leaders.</i>
<u>accountable</u>	Required or expected to justify actions or decisions; responsible. <i>Governments must be accountable to someone beside themselves.</i>
appreciate	Gain in value. <i>Do you appreciate the full meaning of this letter.</i>
appreciative	Having or showing appreciation or a favorable critical judgment or opinion. <i>The team are very appreciative of your support.</i>
<u>beholden</u>	Owing thanks or having a duty to someone in return for help or a service. <i>I don t like to be beholden to anybody.</i>
binding	One of a pair of mechanical devices that are attached to a ski and that will grip a ski boot the bindings should release in case of a fall. <i>The book had a leather binding.</i>
compel	Force or oblige (someone) to do something. <i>By heav n s high will compell d from shore to shore.</i>
debtor	A person, country, or organization that owes money. <i>Debtor countries.</i>
demonstrably	In a way that is clearly apparent or capable of being logically proved. <i>The claim is demonstrably false.</i>
duty	(of a visit or other undertaking) done from a sense of moral obligation rather than for pleasure. <i>Juliet reported for duty.</i>
grateful	Received or experienced with gratitude; welcome. <i>She gave him a grateful smile.</i>
<u>indebted</u>	Under a legal obligation to someone. <i>Heavily indebted countries.</i>

<u>indispensable</u>	Absolutely necessary. <i>He made himself indispensable to the parish priest.</i>
justified	Having, done for, or marked by a good or legitimate reason. <i>The doctors were justified in treating her.</i>
legally	By law; conforming to the law. <i>The weapons were purchased legally.</i>
<u>liable</u>	Held legally responsible. <i>Non resident trustees are liable to the basic rate of tax.</i>
mandatory	Required by law or mandate; compulsory. <i>He did not want the guidelines to be mandatory.</i>
manumission	Release from slavery. <i>A leading advocate of manumission.</i>
morally	In a way that is considered right according to the code of behaviour of a particular society. <i>People expected the government to behave morally.</i>
<u>must</u>	Expressing insistence. <i>Seat belts are an absolute must.</i>
necessary	The action or item needed. <i>A bag containing my wallet the money the necessary.</i>
obligate	Require or compel (someone) to undertake a legal or moral duty. <i>The money must be obligated within 30 days.</i>
obligatory	Required by a legal, moral, or other rule; compulsory. <i>Attendance is obligatory.</i>
require	Require as useful just or proper. <i>We require our secretary to be on time.</i>
required	Required by rule. <i>The corset the garment that ensured the required female shape.</i>
responsibility	The state or fact of having a duty to deal with something or of having control over someone. <i>We expect individuals to take on more responsibility.</i>
<u>responsible</u>	Being the primary cause of something and so able to be blamed or credited for it. <i>She had risen rapidly to a high and responsible position in the civil service.</i>
thank	Used ironically to assign blame or responsibility for something. <i>Mac thanked her for the meal and left.</i>
