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## Associations of "Obligated" (30 Words)

<b>accountability</b>	Responsibility to someone or for some activity. <i>Lack of <b>accountability</b> has corroded public respect for business and political leaders.</i>
<b>accountable</b>	Required or expected to justify actions or decisions; responsible. <i>Governments must be <b>accountable</b> to someone beside themselves.</i>
<b>appreciate</b>	Gain in value. <i>Do you <b>appreciate</b> the full meaning of this letter.</i>
<b>appreciative</b>	Having or showing appreciation or a favorable critical judgment or opinion. <i>The team are very <b>appreciative</b> of your support.</i>
<b>beholden</b>	Owing thanks or having a duty to someone in return for help or a service. <i>I don t like to be <b>beholden</b> to anybody.</i>
<b>binding</b>	One of a pair of mechanical devices that are attached to a ski and that will grip a ski boot the bindings should release in case of a fall. <i>The book had a leather <b>binding</b>.</i>
<b>compel</b>	Force or oblige (someone) to do something. <i>By heav n s high will <b>compell</b> d from shore to shore.</i>
<b>debtor</b>	A person, country, or organization that owes money. <i><b>Debtor</b> countries.</i>
<b>demonstrably</b>	In a way that is clearly apparent or capable of being logically proved. <i>The claim is <b>demonstrably</b> false.</i>
<b>duty</b>	(of a visit or other undertaking) done from a sense of moral obligation rather than for pleasure. <i>Juliet reported for <b>duty</b>.</i>
<b>grateful</b>	Received or experienced with gratitude; welcome. <i>She gave him a <b>grateful</b> smile.</i>
<b>indebted</b>	Under a legal obligation to someone. <i>Heavily <b>indebted</b> countries.</i>

<b><u>indispensable</u></b>	Absolutely necessary. <i>He made himself <b>indispensable</b> to the parish priest.</i>
<b>justified</b>	Having, done for, or marked by a good or legitimate reason. <i>The doctors were <b>justified</b> in treating her.</i>
<b>legally</b>	By law; conforming to the law. <i>The weapons were purchased <b>legally</b>.</i>
<b><u>liable</u></b>	Held legally responsible. <i>Non resident trustees are <b>liable</b> to the basic rate of tax.</i>
<b>mandatory</b>	Required by law or mandate; compulsory. <i>He did not want the guidelines to be <b>mandatory</b>.</i>
<b>manumission</b>	Release from slavery. <i>A leading advocate of <b>manumission</b>.</i>
<b>morally</b>	In a way that is considered right according to the code of behaviour of a particular society. <i>People expected the government to behave <b>morally</b>.</i>
<b><u>must</u></b>	Expressing insistence. <i>Seat belts are an absolute <b>must</b>.</i>
<b>necessary</b>	The action or item needed. <i>A bag containing my wallet the money the <b>necessary</b>.</i>
<b>obligate</b>	Require or compel (someone) to undertake a legal or moral duty. <i>The money must be <b>obligated</b> within 30 days.</i>
<b>obligatory</b>	Required by a legal, moral, or other rule; compulsory. <i>Attendance is <b>obligatory</b>.</i>
<b>require</b>	Require as useful just or proper. <i>We <b>require</b> our secretary to be on time.</i>
<b>required</b>	Required by rule. <i>The corset the garment that ensured the <b>required</b> female shape.</i>
<b>responsibility</b>	The state or fact of having a duty to deal with something or of having control over someone. <i>We expect individuals to take on more <b>responsibility</b>.</i>
<b><u>responsible</u></b>	Being the primary cause of something and so able to be blamed or credited for it. <i>She had risen rapidly to a high and <b>responsible</b> position in the civil service.</i>
<b>thank</b>	Used ironically to assign blame or responsibility for something. <i>Mac <b>thanked</b> her for the meal and left.</i>
