- *Preoccupy or fill the mind of (someone) continually and to a troubling extent.*

<b>be bedevilled</b>	Happen, occur, take place.
<b>be beset</b>	Be identical or equivalent to.
<b>be consumed</b>	Have life, be alive.
<b>be dominated</b>	Be identical to; be someone or something.
<b>be eaten up</b>	To remain unmolested, undisturbed, or uninterrupted — used only in infinitive form.
<b>be fixated</b>	Happen, occur, take place.
<b>be gripped</b>	Occupy a certain position or area.
<b>be haunted</b>	Happen, occur, take place.
<b>be in the grip of</b>	Have life, be alive.
<b>be infatuated</b>	To remain unmolested, undisturbed, or uninterrupted — used only in infinitive form.
<b>be plagued</b>	Happen, occur, take place.

<b>be possessed</b>	Work in a specific place, with a specific subject, or in a specific function.
<b>be preoccupied</b>	Have life, be alive.
<b>be tormented</b>	Have life, be alive.
<b>be uppermost in someone's mind</b>	Occupy a certain position or area.
<b>become an obsession with</b>	Undergo a change or development.
<b>bedevil</b>	(of a person) torment or harass. <i>Projects like this are <b>bedevilled</b> by a shortage of cash.</i>
<b><u>beset</u></b>	Surround and harass. <i>I was <b>beset</b> by clouds of flies.</i>
<b>consume</b>	Serve oneself to or consume regularly. <i>This process <b>consumes</b> enormous amounts of energy.</i>
<b>control</b>	Control others or oneself or influence skillfully usually to one's advantage. <i>There were never enough masters to <b>control</b> the unruly mobs of boys.</i>
<b>dominate</b>	Be the most important or conspicuous person or thing in. <i>A picturesque city <b>dominated</b> by the cathedral tower.</i>
<b>eat up</b>	Take in food; used of animals only.
<b>engross</b>	Gain or keep exclusive possession of (something). <i>They seemed to be <b>engrossed</b> in conversation.</i>
<b><u>ghost</u></b>	Move like a ghost. <i>People who <b>ghost</b> are primarily focused on avoiding their own emotional discomfort.</i>
<b>grip</b>	To grip or seize as in a wrestling match. <i>He <b>gripped</b> the steering wheel.</i>
<b><u>haunt</u></b>	Haunt like a ghost pursue. <i>She <b>haunts</b> the ballet.</i>
<b>have a grip on</b>	Cause to do; cause to act in a specified manner.
<b>have a hold on</b>	Suffer from; be ill with.
<b>hound</b>	Pursue or chase relentlessly. <i>His opponents used the allegations to <b>hound</b> him out of office.</i>
<b><u>monopolize</u></b>	Get or keep exclusively to oneself. <i>He <b>monopolizes</b> the laser printer.</i>

<b>plague</b>	Annoy continually or chronically. <i>He has been <b>plagued</b> by ill health.</i>
<b>possess</b>	Have possession of as distinct from ownership. <i>He just wanted her to <b>possess</b> her.</i>
<b>preoccupy</b>	(of a matter or subject) dominate or engross the mind of (someone) to the exclusion of other thoughts. <i>His mother was <b>preoccupied</b> with paying the bills.</i>
<b>prey on</b>	Prey on or hunt for.
<b>prey on someone's mind</b>	Prey on or hunt for.
<b>rule</b>	Mark or draw with a ruler. <i>The tenth House <b>ruled</b> by Saturn and associated with Capricorn.</i>
<b>take control of</b>	Take somebody somewhere.
<b>take over</b>	Develop a habit.
<b>torment</b>	Torment emotionally or mentally. <i>He was <b>tormented</b> by jealousy.</i>

<b>elated</b>	Exultantly proud and joyful; in high spirits. The <b>elated</b> winner.
<b>enjoy</b>	Derive or receive pleasure from get enjoyment from take pleasure in. I <b>enjoy</b> watching good films.
<b>enjoyable</b>	(of an activity or occasion) giving delight or pleasure. They had an <b>enjoyable</b> afternoon.
<b>euphoric</b>	Characterized by or feeling intense excitement and happiness. A <b>euphoric</b> sense of freedom.
<b>exult</b>	Feel extreme happiness or elation. <b>Exulting</b> in her escape Lisa closed the door behind her.
<b>exultant</b>	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. He waved to the <b>exultant</b> crowds.
<b>exultation</b>	A feeling of triumphant elation or jubilation; rejoicing. She laughs in <b>exultation</b> .
<b>fascinated</b>	Strongly attracted and interested. A crowd of <b>fascinated</b> onlookers.
<b>ghost</b>	Act as ghostwriter of a work. I didn't want to <b>ghost</b> her so we ended up having the talk and it was horrible.
<b>glad</b>	Any of numerous plants of the genus <i>Gladiolus</i> native chiefly to tropical and South Africa having sword-shaped leaves and one-sided spikes of brightly colored funnel-shaped flowers; widely cultivated. Heard the <b>glad</b> news.
<b>grateful</b>	Feeling or showing gratitude. A <b>grateful</b> heart.
<b>haunt</b>	Haunt like a ghost pursue. The bar was a favourite <b>haunt</b> of artists of the time.
<b>hope</b>	A specific instance of feeling hopeful. It revived their <b>hope</b> of winning the pennant.
<b>infatuated</b>	Possessed with an intense but short-lived passion or admiration for someone. An <b>infatuated</b> teenager.

<b>jubilant</b>	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. <i>A large number of <b>jubilant</b> fans ran on to the pitch.</i>
<b>lucky</b>	Having, bringing, or resulting from good luck. <i>Three s my <b>lucky</b> number.</i>
<b>please</b>	Used to ask someone to stop doing something of which the speaker disapproves. <i>What type of fish is this <b>please</b>.</i>
<b>pleased</b>	Experiencing or manifesting pleasure. <i>A <b>pleased</b> smile.</i>
<b>pleasurable</b>	Affording satisfaction or pleasure. <i><b>Pleasurable</b> activities.</i>
<b>pursue</b>	Continue or proceed along (a path or route). <i>Andrew was determined to <b>pursue</b> a computer career.</i>
<b>rejoicing</b>	A feeling of great happiness. <i><b>Rejoicing</b> crowds filled the streets on VJ Day.</i>
<b>think</b>	An act of thinking. <i>I went for a walk to have a <b>think</b>.</i>
<b>vivacious</b>	Vigorous and animated. <i>A <b>vivacious</b> folk dance.</i>
