## Obsolete as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Obsolete" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “obsolete” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(of a part or characteristic of an organism) less developed than formerly or in a related species; rudimentary; vestigial.*
- *No longer produced or used; out of date.*
- *No longer in use.*



## Synonyms of "Obsolete" as an adjective (10 Words)

<b>disused</b>	No longer in use. <i>They held an exhibition in a <b>disused</b> warehouse.</i>
<b>embryonic</b>	Of an organism prior to birth or hatching. <i>The <b>embryonic</b> government staffed by survivors of the massacre.</i>
<u>immature</u>	(of birds) not yet having developed feathers. <i>Many of the fish caught are <b>immature</b>.</i>
<u>incomplete</u>	Not full or finished. <i>An <b>incomplete</b> account of his life.</i>
<b>old-fashioned</b>	Out of fashion.
<b>out of date</b>	Knocked unconscious by a heavy blow.
<u>outdated</u>	Out of date; obsolete. <i><b>Outdated</b> equipment.</i>

<b>outmoded</b>	Out of fashion. <i><b>Outmoded</b> ideas.</i>
<b>rudimentary</b>	Relating to an immature, undeveloped, or basic form. <i>These <b>rudimentary</b> truths.</i>
<b>undeveloped</b>	Undeveloped or unused. <i>Taxes on <b>undeveloped</b> lots are low.</i>

## Associations of "Obsolete" (30 Words)

### aged

Used of tobacco aging as a preservative process aged is pronounced as one syllable.

*Young people **aged** 14 to 18.*

### aging

The organic process of growing older and showing the effects of increasing age.

### **anachronistic**

Belonging to a period other than that being portrayed.

*She is rebelling against the **anachronistic** morality of her parents.*

### ancient

A person who lived in ancient times.

***Ancient** forests.*

### **antediluvian**

So extremely old as seeming to belong to an earlier period.

***Antediluvian** ideas.*

### antiquated

Old-fashioned or outdated.

*This **antiquated** central heating system.*

<b>antique</b>	Search or shop for antiques. <i>Sanding will change the lustre of the sanded spot especially if the finish has been <b>antiqued</b>.</i>
<b>antiquity</b>	The historic period preceding the Middle Ages in Europe. <i>A church of great <b>antiquity</b>.</i>
<u><b>archaic</b></u>	So extremely old as seeming to belong to an earlier period. <i>Prisons are run on <b>archaic</b> methods.</i>
<u><b>dated</b></u>	Marked with a date. <i>A <b>dated</b> expression.</i>
<b>dilapidated</b>	(of a building or object) in a state of disrepair or ruin as a result of age or neglect. <i>The tank was now rather <b>dilapidated</b>.</i>
<u><b>elder</b></u>	A person who is older than one by a specified length of time. <i>A council of village <b>elders</b>.</i>
<b>elderly</b>	People who are old collectively. <i><b>Elderly</b> residents could remember the construction of the first skyscraper.</i>
<b>historical</b>	(especially of a novel or film) set in the past. <i>Doubt that a <b>historical</b> Camelot every existed.</i>
<u><b>invalid</b></u>	Disable (someone) by injury or illness. <i>She spent the rest of her life as an <b>invalid</b>.</i>
<u><b>moot</b></u>	Raise (a question or topic) for discussion; suggest (an idea or possibility). <i>He organized the weekly <b>moot</b>.</i>
<b>obsolescent</b>	Becoming obsolete. <i><b>Obsolescent</b> slang.</i>
<b>old</b>	Past times especially in the phrase in days of old. <i>Good <b>old</b> boy.</i>
<b>ossified</b>	Set in a rigidly conventional pattern of behavior, habits, or beliefs. <i>An <b>ossified</b> institution.</i>
<u><b>outdated</b></u>	Out of date; obsolete. <i><b>Outdated</b> equipment.</i>
<b>paleolithic</b>	Of or relating to the second period of the Stone Age (following the eolithic). <i><b>Paleolithic</b> artifacts.</i>
<b>prehistory</b>	The period of time before written records. <i>The <b>prehistory</b> of capitalism.</i>

<b>ruined</b>	Having been irreparably damaged or harmed. <i>His <b>ruined</b> career.</i>
<b><u>senile</u></b>	Mentally or physically infirm with age. <i><b>Senile</b> decay.</i>
<b>stodgy</b>	Heavy and starchy and hard to digest. <i>He loves <b>stodgy</b> puddings.</i>
<b>stuffy</b>	Excessively conventional and unimaginative and hence dull. <i>Inhaling vapour from a bowl of hot water may help to clear a <b>stuffy</b> nose.</i>
<b>superannuated</b>	Old; no longer valid or fashionable. <i><b>Superannuated</b> computing equipment.</i>
<b>traditional</b>	Habitually done, used, or found. <i><b>Traditional</b> history.</i>
<b><u>useless</u></b>	Having no ability or skill in a specified activity or area. <i>We tried to pacify him but it was <b>useless</b>.</i>
<b>yore</b>	Time long past.
