

Obsolete as an Adjective

Definitions of "Obsolete" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “obsolete” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(of a part or characteristic of an organism) less developed than formerly or in a related species; rudimentary; vestigial.*
- *No longer produced or used; out of date.*
- *No longer in use.*



Synonyms of "Obsolete" as an adjective (10 Words)

disused	No longer in use. <i>They held an exhibition in a disused warehouse.</i>
embryonic	Of an organism prior to birth or hatching. <i>The embryonic government staffed by survivors of the massacre.</i>
<u>immature</u>	(of birds) not yet having developed feathers. <i>Many of the fish caught are immature.</i>
<u>incomplete</u>	Not full or finished. <i>An incomplete account of his life.</i>
old-fashioned	Out of fashion.
out of date	Knocked unconscious by a heavy blow.
<u>outdated</u>	Out of date; obsolete. <i>Outdated equipment.</i>

outmoded	Out of fashion. <i>Outmoded ideas.</i>
rudimentary	Relating to an immature, undeveloped, or basic form. <i>These rudimentary truths.</i>
undeveloped	Undeveloped or unused. <i>Taxes on undeveloped lots are low.</i>



Usage Examples of "Obsolete" as an adjective

- *Obsolete words.*
- *The disposal of old and obsolete machinery.*
- *The phrase was obsolete after 1625.*



Associations of "Obsolete" (30 Words)

aged

Used of tobacco aging as a preservative process aged is pronounced as one syllable.

*Young people **aged** 14 to 18.*

aging

The organic process of growing older and showing the effects of increasing age.

anachronistic

Belonging to a period other than that being portrayed.

*She is rebelling against the **anachronistic** morality of her parents.*

ancient

A person who lived in ancient times.

***Ancient** forests.*

antediluvian

So extremely old as seeming to belong to an earlier period.

***Antediluvian** ideas.*

antiquated

Old-fashioned or outdated.

*This **antiquated** central heating system.*

antique	Search or shop for antiques. <i>Sanding will change the lustre of the sanded spot especially if the finish has been antiqued.</i>
antiquity	The historic period preceding the Middle Ages in Europe. <i>A church of great antiquity.</i>
<u>archaic</u>	So extremely old as seeming to belong to an earlier period. <i>Prisons are run on archaic methods.</i>
<u>dated</u>	Marked with a date. <i>A dated expression.</i>
dilapidated	(of a building or object) in a state of disrepair or ruin as a result of age or neglect. <i>The tank was now rather dilapidated.</i>
<u>elder</u>	A person who is older than one by a specified length of time. <i>A council of village elders.</i>
elderly	People who are old collectively. <i>Elderly residents could remember the construction of the first skyscraper.</i>
historical	(especially of a novel or film) set in the past. <i>Doubt that a historical Camelot every existed.</i>
<u>invalid</u>	Disable (someone) by injury or illness. <i>She spent the rest of her life as an invalid.</i>
<u>moot</u>	Raise (a question or topic) for discussion; suggest (an idea or possibility). <i>He organized the weekly moot.</i>
obsolescent	Becoming obsolete. <i>Obsolescent slang.</i>
old	Past times especially in the phrase in days of old. <i>Good old boy.</i>
ossified	Set in a rigidly conventional pattern of behavior, habits, or beliefs. <i>An ossified institution.</i>
<u>outdated</u>	Out of date; obsolete. <i>Outdated equipment.</i>
paleolithic	Of or relating to the second period of the Stone Age (following the eolithic). <i>Paleolithic artifacts.</i>
prehistory	The period of time before written records. <i>The prehistory of capitalism.</i>

ruined	Having been irreparably damaged or harmed. <i>His ruined career.</i>
<u>senile</u>	Mentally or physically infirm with age. <i>Senile decay.</i>
stodgy	Heavy and starchy and hard to digest. <i>He loves stodgy puddings.</i>
stuffy	Excessively conventional and unimaginative and hence dull. <i>Inhaling vapour from a bowl of hot water may help to clear a stuffy nose.</i>
superannuated	Old; no longer valid or fashionable. <i>Superannuated computing equipment.</i>
traditional	Habitually done, used, or found. <i>Traditional history.</i>
<u>useless</u>	Having no ability or skill in a specified activity or area. <i>We tried to pacify him but it was useless.</i>
yore	Time long past.
