Definitions of "Obsolete" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "obsolete" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- (of a part or characteristic of an organism) less developed than formerly or in a related species; rudimentary; vestigial.
- No longer produced or used; out of date.
- No longer in use.





Synonyms of "Obsolete" as an adjective (10 Words)

disused	No longer in use. They held an exhibition in a disused warehouse.
embryonic	Of an organism prior to birth or hatching. The embryonic government staffed by survivors of the massacre.
<u>immature</u>	(of birds) not yet having developed feathers. Many of the fish caught are immature .
<u>incomplete</u>	Not full or finished. An incomplete account of his life.
old-fashioned	Out of fashion.
out of date	Knocked unconscious by a heavy blow.
outdated	Out of date; obsolete. <i>Outdated</i> equipment.



outmoded	Out of fashion. <i>Outmoded</i> ideas.
<u>rudimentary</u>	Relating to an immature, undeveloped, or basic form. <i>These rudimentary</i> truths.
undeveloped	Undeveloped or unused. Taxes on undeveloped lots are low.



Usage Examples of "Obsolete" as an adjective

- The phrase was obsolete after 1625.

<u>ancient</u>	A person who lived in ancient times. <i>Ancient forests.</i>
antediluvian	So extremely old as seeming to belong to an earlier period. <i>Antediluvian ideas.</i>
antiquated	Old-fashioned or outdated. This antiquated central heating system.

Disable (someone) by injury or illness. She spent the rest of her life as an invalid .
Raise (a question or topic) for discussion; suggest (an idea or possibility. <i>He organized the weekly moot.</i>
Becoming obsolete. Obsolescent slang.
Past times especially in the phrase in days of old. Good old boy.
Set in a rigidly conventional pattern of behavior, habits, or beliefs. <i>An ossified institution.</i>
Out of date; obsolete. Outdated equipment.
Of or relating to the second period of the Stone Age (following the eolithic. <i>Paleolithic</i> artifacts.
The period of time before written records. The prehistory of capitalism.
