- Sporadically and infrequently.

### Synonyms of "Occasionally" as an adverb (12 Words)

**intermittently** At irregular intervals; not continuously or steadily.

**At uneven or varying rates or intervals.**

**now and again** Used to preface a command or reproof or request.

**now and then** At the present moment.

**off and on** At a distance in space or time.



**on and off** At a distance in space or time.

once in a while On one occasion.

periodically From time to time; occasionally.

The newsletter is sent out **periodically** to update members.

on certain occasions or in certain cases but not always.

**Sometimes** I want to do things on my own.

With spasms.

**spasmodically** The mouth was slightly open and jerked violently and **spasmodically** at

one corner.

sporadically In a sporadic manner.

He worked **sporadically** at part time jobs.
