According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "occasionally" as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- At infrequent or irregular intervals; now and then.
- Now and then or here and there.
- Sporadically and infrequently.

### Synonyms of "Occasionally" as an adverb (12 Words)

infrequently	Not many times. He cooks but only <b>infrequently</b> .
intermittently	At irregular intervals; not continuously or steadily. An <b>intermittently</b> amusing plot.
irregularly	At uneven or varying rates or intervals. An <b>irregularly</b> inflected plural.
now and again	Used to preface a command or reproof or request.
now and then	At the present moment.
off and on	At a distance in space or time.



on and off	At a distance in space or time.	
once in a while On one occasion.		
periodically	From time to time; occasionally. The newsletter is sent out <b>periodically</b> to update members.	
<u>sometimes</u>	On certain occasions or in certain cases but not always. <b>Sometimes</b> I want to do things on my own.	
spasmodically	With spasms. The mouth was slightly open and jerked violently and <b>spasmodically</b> at one corner.	
sporadically	In a sporadic manner. He worked <b>sporadically</b> at part time jobs.	

### Usage Examples of "Occasionally" as an adverb

- He was arrogant and occasionally callous.
- We met up occasionally for a drink.
- Open areas are only occasionally interrupted by clumps of trees.
- Very occasionally the condition can result in death.

always	Without variation or change, in every case. Isabel had <b>always</b> been in rude health.
<u>barely</u>	Only a very short time before. It was <b>barely</b> 5 a m.
consecutively	In a consecutive manner. Jeremy smoked four cigarettes <b>consecutively</b> .
<u>dabble</u>	Dip a foot or hand briefly into a liquid. <i>He <b>dabble</b>d in left wing politics.</i>
<u>ever</u>	At all times all the time and on every occasion. Don t you <b>ever</b> regret giving up all that money.
<u>frequency</u>	The ratio of the number of observations in a statistical category to the total number of observations. An increase in the <b>frequency</b> of accidents due to increased overtime.
<u>frequent</u>	Frequently encountered. Walls flanked by <b>frequent</b> square towers.



<u>frequently</u>	Many times at short intervals. They go abroad <b>frequently</b> .
<u>hardly</u>	Only a very short time before. We <b>hardly</b> know each other.
infrequently	Not many times. A storage area for <b>infrequently</b> used items.
<u>intermittent</u>	Occurring at irregular intervals; not continuous or steady. <i>Intermittent rain</i> .
intermittently	At irregular intervals; not continuously or steadily. An <b>intermittently</b> amusing plot.
occasional	Recurring or reappearing from time to time. <b>Occasional</b> freelancer seeks full time position.
oft	Many times at short intervals. We <b>oft</b> en met over a cup of coffee.
often	Frequently or in great quantities. <i>He <b>often</b> goes for long walks by himself.</i>
oftentimes	Many times at short intervals. Sensory processing is <b>oftentimes</b> a challenge for someone with ASD.
<u>periodic</u>	Relating to the periodic table of the elements. The <b>periodic</b> visits she made to her father.
periodically	From time to time; occasionally. The newsletter is sent out <b>periodically</b> to update members.
<u>rare</u>	Having low density. A <b>rare</b> appearance.
<u>rarely</u>	Not often. We <b>rarely</b> met.
rareness	Noteworthy scarcity.
<u>rarity</u>	Noteworthy scarcity. The <b>rarity</b> of the condition.
<u>recidivism</u>	Habitual relapse into crime. The prison has succeeded in reducing <b>recidivism</b> .
<u>scarce</u>	Scarcely. Had <b>scarce</b> ly rung the bell when the door flew open.
<u>seldom</u>	Not often. A great but <b>seldom</b> pleasure.
<u>sometimes</u>	Occasionally, rather than all of the time. <b>Sometimes</b> I want to do things on my own.



<u>sparse</u>	Thinly dispersed or scattered. Information on earnings is <b>sparse</b> .
<u>sporadic</u>	Occurring at irregular intervals or only in a few places; scattered or isolated. A city subjected to <b>sporadic</b> bombing raids.
sporadically	In a sporadic manner. The comedy is only <b>sporadically</b> funny.
successively	In proper order or sequence. Three letters of <b>successively</b> decreasing length.
