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| affair | Business and financial dealings. <i>The board admitted responsibility for the affair.</i> |
| appearance | Pretending that something is the case in order to make a good impression. <i>The rookie made a brief appearance in the first period.</i> |
| circumstance | The set of facts or circumstances that surround a situation or event. <i>We wanted to marry but circumstances didn't permit.</i> |
| contingency | A future event or circumstance which is possible but cannot be predicted with certainty. <i>The island's public affairs can occasionally be seen to be invaded by contingency.</i> |
| development | A specified state of growth or advancement. <i>The development of his ideas took many years.</i> |
| event | Each of several particular contests making up a sports competition. <i>In that event the first possibility is excluded.</i> |
| eventuality | A possible event or outcome. <i>Be prepared for all eventualities.</i> |

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| existence | The fact or state of living or having objective reality. <i>She kept the company alive when its very existence was threatened.</i> |
| experience | The knowledge or skill acquired by a period of practical experience of something especially that gained in a particular profession. <i>He recalled the experience vividly.</i> |
| happening | An event that happens. <i>Altogether it was an eerie happening.</i> |
| incident | The occurrence of dangerous or exciting things. <i>One person was stabbed in the incident.</i> |
| instance | An example or single occurrence of something. <i>Another instance occurred yesterday.</i> |
| manifestation | A clear appearance. <i>A characteristic manifestation of Lyme disease.</i> |
| materialization | The process of coming into being; becoming reality. <i>This skyscraper is the solid materialization of his efforts.</i> |
| matter | A subject or situation under consideration. <i>Financial matters.</i> |
| natural event | A first roll of 7 or 11 that immediately wins the stake. |
| occurrent | An event that happens. |
| phenomenon | Any state or process known through the senses rather than by intuition or reasoning. <i>The band was a pop phenomenon just for their sales figures alone.</i> |
| springing up | A metal elastic device that returns to its shape or position when pushed or pulled or pressed. |

- *The occurrence (or presence) of life on other planets.*
- *The occurrence of natural gas fields.*

| happen | Happen occur or be the case in the course of events or by chance. <i>This is what happens when the mechanism goes wrong.</i> |
| happening | An event that happens. <i>Altogether it was an eerie happening.</i> |
| inaugural | An inaugural speech especially one made by an incoming US president. <i>His inaugural concert as Music Director.</i> |
| <u>incidence</u> | The striking of a light beam on a surface. <i>The point of incidence of the beam.</i> |
| <u>incident</u> | Relating to incidence. <i>Several amusing incidents.</i> |
| incidental | An item that is incidental. <i>The incidental catch of dolphins in the pursuit of tuna.</i> |
| junction | The set of features in speech that enable a hearer to detect a word or phrase boundary (e.g. distinguishing I scream from ice cream). <i>The plane crashed at the junction of two mountains.</i> |
| kaput | Destroyed or killed. <i>The water pump s broken kaput.</i> |

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| <u>malfunction</u> | A failure to function normally. <i>The coffee maker malfunctioned.</i> |
| occasion | Give occasion to. <i>An occasion arranged to honor the president.</i> |
| occur | Happen; take place. <i>Nothing occurred that seemed important.</i> |
| outcome | Something that results. <i>It is the outcome of the vote that counts.</i> |
| <u>output</u> | A place where power or information leaves a system. <i>Output from the mine ceased in May.</i> |
| participation | The action of taking part in something. <i>The scheme is based on employer participation.</i> |
| pentathlon | An athletic event comprising five different events for each competitor in particular also modern pentathlon an event involving fencing shooting swimming riding and cross country running. |
| <u>phenomenon</u> | A remarkable development. <i>The band was a pop phenomenon just for their sales figures alone.</i> |
| <u>recurring</u> | Coming back. <i>Gratitude is a recurring theme in the book.</i> |
| sequent | In regular succession without gaps. <i>The period of tension and consequent need for military preparedness.</i> |
| <u>traumatic</u> | Of or relating to a physical injury or wound to the body. <i>Few experiences are more traumatic than losing a child.</i> |
| <u>unexpected</u> | Not expected or anticipated. <i>His death was totally unexpected.</i> |
| <u>unforeseen</u> | Not anticipated- H.W.Glidden. <i>Our insurance package enables you to protect yourself and your dependants against unforeseen circumstances.</i> |
| upcoming | About to happen; forthcoming. <i>The upcoming election.</i> |
