| adequacy | The quality of being able to meet a need satisfactorily. <i>The adequacy of testing procedures.</i> |
| adequate | Having the requisite qualities or resources to meet a task. <i>The food was adequate.</i> |
| affluent | An affluent person a person who is financially well off. <i>The affluent societies of the western world.</i> |
| ample | (of a person's figure) full or broad. <i>Had ample food for the party.</i> |
| amply | To an ample degree or in an ample manner. <i>These voices were amply represented.</i> |
| appropriately | In a manner that is suitable or proper in the circumstances. <i>Volunteers need to be approachable calm and able to respond appropriately.</i> |
| bountiful | Large in quantity; abundant. <i>Bountiful compliments.</i> |
| bountifulness | The property of copious abundance. |
| bounty | Something given or occurring in generous amounts. <i>For millennia the people along the Nile have depended entirely on its bounty.</i> |
| copious | Affording an abundant supply. <i>I had been a little too copious in talking of my country.</i> |

| copiously | In an abundant manner. <i>His book is copiously annotated with references to the current debates.</i> |
| exceeding | Extremely exceedingly. <i>She spoke warmly of his exceeding kindness.</i> |
| fully | No less or fewer than (used to emphasize an amount). <i>Fully 65 per cent of all funerals are by cremation.</i> |
| lot | A plot of land assigned for sale or for a particular use. <i>It s just one lot of rich people stealing from another.</i> |
| mellowness | A feeling of good humor and sympathy through maturity or intoxication or a relaxed state. <i>A mellowness of light and shade not attainable in marble.</i> |
| <u>moderately</u> | To a moderately sufficient extent or degree. <i>Both hotels are moderately priced.</i> |
| passable | Able to be passed or traversed or crossed. <i>He spoke passable English.</i> |
| plentiful | Existing in great number or quantity. <i>A plentiful year.</i> |
| plentitude | A full supply. |
| <u>plenty</u> | As much as necessary. <i>Such natural phenomena as famine and plenty.</i> |
| <u>sizable</u> | Fairly large. <i>A sizable fortune.</i> |
| <u>spacious</u> | Having ample space. <i>Spacious skies.</i> |
| <u>suffice</u> | Meet the needs of. <i>Two examples should suffice to prove the contention.</i> |
| sufficiency | Self sufficiency or independence of character especially of an arrogant or imperious sort. <i>He questioned the sufficiency of human intelligence.</i> |
| <u>sufficient</u> | Of a quantity that can fulfill a need or requirement but without being abundant. <i>We have sufficient reason for supposing this to be the case.</i> |
| suitability | The quality of being right or appropriate for a particular person, purpose, or situation. <i>The suitability of residential accommodation varied widely.</i> |
| unprecedented | Never done or known before. <i>An unprecedented expansion in population and industry.</i> |
