- smell** A quality in something that is perceived by the faculty of smell an odour or scent.
*It had the **smell** of treason.*

ambergris	A waxy substance that originates as a secretion in the intestines of the sperm whale, found floating in tropical seas and used in perfume manufacture.
ambrosial	Extremely pleasing to the taste; sweet and fragrant. <i>Ambrosial food.</i>
<u>aroma</u>	A distinctive odor that is pleasant. <i>The aroma of officialdom.</i>
<u>aromatic</u>	An aromatic compound. <i>An aromatic organic compound.</i>
foul	Commit a foul break the rules. <i>Foul the water.</i>
<u>fragrance</u>	A distinctive odor that is pleasant. <i>The fragrance of fresh ground coffee.</i>

frankincense	An aromatic gum resin obtained from various Arabian or East African trees; formerly valued for worship and for embalming and fumigation.
incense	Perfume with incense or a similar fragrance. <i>Incense filled the room.</i>
infuriate	Make (someone) extremely angry and impatient. <i>I was infuriated by your article.</i>
malodorous	Having an unpleasant smell. <i>Leaking taps and malodorous drains.</i>
musk	A strong smelling reddish brown substance which is secreted by the male musk deer for scent marking and is an important ingredient in perfumery.
musky	Resembling the smell of musk.
musty	Stale and unclean smelling. <i>A dark musty library.</i>
nosegay	A small bunch of flowers, typically one that is sweet-scented. <i>A nosegay worn at the waist or bodice.</i>
odoriferous	Emitting an odor. <i>An odoriferous pile of fish.</i>
odorous	Having a natural fragrance. <i>A dark and odorous cave.</i>
olfaction	The faculty that enables us to distinguish scents.
olfactory	Relating to the sense of smell. <i>The olfactory organs.</i>
<u>perfume</u>	Impregnate with perfume or a sweet smelling substance. <i>Her hair was oiled and perfumed.</i>
perfumery	A shop that sells perfumes. <i>A department store perfumery.</i>
reek	Have an element suggestive (of something). <i>The building reeks of smoke.</i>
<u>scent</u>	Sniff the air for a scent. <i>The bull advanced scents the breeze at every step.</i>
<u>sensory</u>	Relating to or concerned in sensation. <i>Sensory neurons.</i>
shifty	(of a person or their manner) appearing deceitful or evasive. <i>He had a shifty look about him.</i>
smell	Smell bad. <i>Campaigners can smell victory after a long battle.</i>

sniff An act or sound of sniffing.
*The Olympic hosts will at least get a **sniff** at a medal.*

stench A distinctive odor that is offensively unpleasant.
*The **stench** of rotting fish.*

stink Having a strong unpleasant smell.
*The **stink** of the place hit me as I went in.*

waft A gentle movement of air.
*Sounds **wafted** into the room.*

whiff Perceive by inhaling through the nose.
***Whiffs** of smoke emerged from the boiler.*
