| <b>diverse</b>              | Distinctly dissimilar or unlike.<br><i>Subjects as <b>diverse</b> as architecture language teaching and the physical sciences.</i>  |
| <b>diversity</b>            | The state of being diverse; variety.<br><i>There was considerable <b>diversity</b> in the style of the reports.</i>   |
| <b>hierarchic</b>           | Classified according to various criteria into successive levels or layers.<br><i>It has been said that only a <b>hierarchic</b> society with a leisure class at the top can produce works of art.</i> |
| <b>identify</b>             | Identify as in botany or biology for example.<br><i>The judge ordered that the girl should not be identified.</i>   |
