<b>abolish</b>	Do away with. <i>The tax was <b>abolished</b> in 1977.</i>
<b>abrogate</b>	Revoke formally. <i>A proposal to <b>abrogate</b> temporarily the right to strike.</i>
<b>abrogation</b>	The repeal or abolition of a law, right, or agreement.
<b>annul</b>	Declare invalid. <i>Her first marriage was finally <b>annulled</b> by His Holiness.</i>
<a href="#">cancel</a>	A notation cancelling a previous sharp or flat. <i>A stamp franked and with an adhesive <b>cancel</b>.</i>
<a href="#">delete</a>	Cut or eliminate. <i>You can use <b>delete</b> to remove a number of lines from your program.</i>
<a href="#">devoid</a>	Entirely lacking or free from. <i>The sentence was <b>devoid</b> of meaning.</i>
<b>embedded</b>	(of an object) fixed firmly and deeply in a surrounding mass; implanted. <i>The <b>embedded</b> sentence has no overt introducer.</i>
<a href="#">exterminate</a>	Kill (a pest). <i>Hitler wanted to <b>exterminate</b> the Jews Gypsies Communists and homosexuals of Europe.</i>
<a href="#">invalidate</a>	Take away the legal force of or render ineffective. <i><b>Invalidate</b> a contract.</i>
<b>locate</b>	Take up residence and become established. <i>Engineers were working to <b>locate</b> the fault.</i>
<b>naught</b>	Complete failure. <i>It was all for <b>naught</b>.</i>
<b>nil</b>	Non-existent. <i>Reduced to <b>nil</b> all the work we had done.</i>

<b>no</b>	A radioactive transuranic element synthesized by bombarding curium with carbon ions 7 isotopes are known. <i>Have you <b>no</b> decency.</i>
<b>none</b>	By no amount; not at all. <i>It is made <b>none</b> the easier by the differences in approach.</i>
<b>nothing</b>	Having no prospect of progress; of no value. <i>He looks <b>nothing</b> like the others.</i>
<b>nowhere</b>	An insignificant place. <i>A <b>nowhere</b> job.</i>
<b>null</b>	Combine a signal with another in order to create a null cancel out. <i><b>Null</b> and void.</i>
<b>nullify</b>	Make ineffective by counterbalancing the effect of. <i>Judges were unwilling to <b>nullify</b> government decisions.</i>
<b>override</b>	Prevail over. <i>This commitment should <b>override</b> all other considerations.</i>
<b>recantation</b>	A disavowal or taking back of a previous assertion. <i>Every writer interprets Galileo's <b>recantation</b> in a different way.</i>
<b>reject</b>	The person or thing that is rejected or set aside as inferior in quality. <i>His body could begin to <b>reject</b> the implanted heart.</i>
<b>remove</b>	Remove something concrete as by lifting pushing or taking off or remove something abstract. <i>An explanation that is far <b>removed</b> from the truth.</i>
<b>repeal</b>	The act of abrogating; an official or legal cancellation. <i>The House voted in favour of <b>repeal</b>.</i>
<b>rescind</b>	Cancel officially. <i>The government eventually <b>rescinded</b> the directive.</i>
<b>retraction</b>	The act of pulling or holding or drawing a part back. <i>Prey are grasped between the jaws upon tongue <b>retraction</b>.</i>
<b>revoke</b>	Officially cancel (a decree, decision, or promise). <i>He <b>revoked</b> the ban on smoking.</i>
<b>transience</b>	The state or fact of lasting only for a short time; transitoriness. <i>The <b>transience</b> of life and happiness.</i>
<b>withdrawal</b>	The act of taking out money or other capital. <i>The <b>withdrawal</b> of French troops from Vietnam.</i>
<b>zero</b>	Adjust as by firing under test conditions the zero of a gun. <i>The goal is <b>zero</b> population growth.</i>
