<b>boundless</b>	Seemingly boundless in amount number degree or especially extent. <i>Enthusiasts who devote <b>boundless</b> energy to their hobby.</i>
<a href="#"><b>general</b></a>	Prevailing among and common to the general public. <i>Bearing a <b>general</b> resemblance to the original.</i>
<a href="#"><b>global</b></a>	Relating to or encompassing the whole of something, or of a group of things. <i><b>Global</b> monetary policy.</i>
<a href="#"><b>infinite</b></a>	Very great in amount or degree. <i>He bathed the wound with <b>infinite</b> care.</i>
<b>permeating</b>	Spreading or spread throughout.

<u>pervasive</u>	(especially of an unwelcome influence or physical effect) spreading widely throughout an area or a group of people. <i>Ageism is <b>pervasive</b> and entrenched in our society.</i>
<b>present everywhere</b>	Being or existing in a specified place.
<b>ubiquitous</b>	Present, appearing, or found everywhere. <i>His <b>ubiquitous</b> influence was felt by all the family.</i>
<u>universal</u>	Relating to or done by all people or things in the world or in a particular group; applicable to all cases. <i>The play opened to <b>universal</b> acclaim.</i>
<u>worldwide</u>	Of worldwide scope or applicability. <i>A <b>worldwide</b> epidemic.</i>

## Associations of "Omnipresent" (30 Words)

<b>acceptation</b>	A particular sense or the generally recognized meaning common acceptance of a word or phrase.
<b>common</b>	Having no special distinction or quality widely known or commonly encountered average or ordinary or usual. <i>The <b>common</b> housefly.</i>
<b>commonplace</b>	A notable passage in a work copied into a commonplace book. <i><b>Commonplace</b> everyday activities.</i>
<u>comparatively</u>	To a moderate degree as compared to something else; relatively. <i>Inflation was <b>comparatively</b> low.</i>
<b>current</b>	In common or general use. <i>The raft floated downstream on the <b>current</b>.</i>
<b>currently</b>	At the present time. <i><b>Currently</b> they live in Connecticut.</i>
<b>distributive</b>	A distributive word. <i>Transport and <b>distributive</b> industries.</i>
<b>epoch</b>	(astronomy) an arbitrarily fixed date that is the point in time relative to which information (as coordinates of a celestial body) is recorded. <i>The Pliocene <b>epoch</b>.</i>
<b>everywhere</b>	All places or directions. <i>You find fast food stores <b>everywhere</b>.</i>

<b><u>fashionable</u></b>	Popular and considered appealing or fashionable at the time. <i>They risked being scoffed at by their more <b>fashionable</b> friends.</i>
<b>imbue</b>	Fill soak or imbue totally. <i>His works are invariably <b>imbued</b> with a sense of calm and serenity.</i>
<b>immanent</b>	Of a mental act performed entirely within the mind. <i>A cognition is an <b>immanent</b> act of mind.</i>
<b><u>invasive</u></b>	Tending to spread very quickly and undesirably or harmfully. <i>The sound of the piano was <b>invasive</b>.</i>
<b>normal</b>	Conforming with or constituting a norm or standard or level or type or social norm not abnormal. <i><b>Normal</b> working hours.</i>
<b>nowadays</b>	In these times. <i>It is solely by their language that the upper classes <b>nowadays</b> are distinguished.</i>
<b><u>permeate</u></b>	Pass through. <i>His personality has begun to <b>permeate</b> through the whole organization.</i>
<b><u>pervade</u></b>	(especially of a smell) spread through and be perceived in every part of. <i>A smell of stale cabbage <b>pervaded</b> the air.</i>
<b><u>pervasive</u></b>	Spreading or spread throughout. <i>An error is <b>pervasive</b> if it is material to more than one conclusion.</i>
<b>present</b>	Formally present a debutante a representative of a country etc. <i>She did not expect to find herself in her <b>present</b> situation.</i>
<b><u>prevalent</u></b>	Widespread in a particular area or at a particular time. <i>The social ills <b>prevalent</b> in society today.</i>
<b>realized</b>	Successfully completed or brought to an end. <i>The joy of a <b>realized</b> ambition overcame him.</i>
<b><u>today</u></b>	On this day as distinct from yesterday or tomorrow. <i><b>Today</b> we have computers.</i>
<b><u>typical</u></b>	Showing the characteristics expected of or popularly associated with a particular person or thing. <i>The <b>typical</b> car owner drives 10 000 miles a year.</i>
<b>ubiquitous</b>	Present, appearing, or found everywhere. <i>Cowboy hats are <b>ubiquitous</b> among the male singers.</i>
<b>ubiquity</b>	The state of being everywhere at once (or seeming to be everywhere at once). <i>The growing <b>ubiquity</b> of advertising.</i>

<u>unimpressive</u>	Not capable of impressing. <i>He was a man of <b>unimpressive</b> appearance.</i>
<b>up-to-date</b>	The present.
<b>whereabouts</b>	The general location where something is. <i><b>Whereabouts</b> do you come from.</i>
<u>widespread</u>	Found or distributed over a large area or number of people. <i>Drug use is <b>widespread</b>.</i>
