| deity | The creator and supreme being (in a monotheistic religion such as Christianity). <i>A deity of ancient Greece.</i> |
| <u>divine</u> | Resulting from divine providence. <i>Her pies were simply divine.</i> |
| <u>divinity</u> | White creamy fudge made with egg whites. <i>A doctor of divinity.</i> |
| ecclesiastical | Of or associated with a church (especially a Christian Church). <i>The ecclesiastical hierarchy.</i> |
| enshrine | Preserve (a right, tradition, or idea) in a form that ensures it will be protected and respected. <i>The right of all workers to strike was enshrined in the new constitution.</i> |
| godly | Emanating from God. <i>Leading a godly life.</i> |
| hallowed | Worthy of religious veneration. <i>Hallowed ground.</i> |
| <u>heavenly</u> | Of the heavens or sky. <i>Heavenly constellations.</i> |
| liturgy | A religious service conducted according to a liturgy. <i>At the conclusion of the liturgy the Bishop presented the certificates.</i> |
| omnipotent | Having unlimited power. <i>God is described as omnipotent and benevolent.</i> |
| omniscience | The state of knowing everything. <i>The notion of divine omniscience.</i> |
| orison | A prayer. |

| pantheon | A temple to all the gods. <i>The deities of the Hindu pantheon.</i> |
| paradise | An ideal or idyllic place or state. <i>Martyrs who die in battle with the ungodly earn instant transmission to paradise.</i> |
| sacred | Made or declared or believed to be holy; devoted to a deity or some religious ceremony or use. <i>A private office sacred to the President.</i> |
| sacrosanct | (especially of a principle, place, or routine) regarded as too important or valuable to be interfered with. <i>The individual's right to work has been upheld as sacrosanct.</i> |
| scripture | The sacred writings of Christianity contained in the Bible. <i>Passages of scripture.</i> |
| theologian | A person who engages or is an expert in theology. |
| theological | Of or relating to or concerning theology. <i>A reworking of the past that was partly theological.</i> |
| theology | A particular system or school of religious beliefs and teachings. <i>Jewish theology.</i> |
| worship | The activity of worshipping. <i>Worship of the Mother Goddess.</i> |
