| <b><u>divine</u></b>   | Resulting from divine providence.<br><i>Her pies were simply <b>divine</b>.</i>  |
| <b><u>divinity</u></b> | White creamy fudge made with egg whites.<br><i>A doctor of <b>divinity</b>.</i>  |
| <b>ecclesiastical</b>  | Of or associated with a church (especially a Christian Church).<br><i>The <b>ecclesiastical</b> hierarchy.</i>   |
| <b>enshrine</b>        | Preserve (a right, tradition, or idea) in a form that ensures it will be protected and respected.<br><i>The right of all workers to strike was <b>enshrined</b> in the new constitution.</i> |
| <b>godly</b>           | Emanating from God.<br><i>Leading a <b>godly</b> life.</i>   |
| <b>hallowed</b>        | Worthy of religious veneration.<br><i><b>Hallowed</b> ground.</i>  |
| <b><u>heavenly</u></b> | Of the heavens or sky.<br><i><b>Heavenly</b> constellations.</i>   |
