<b>almighty</b>	Having complete power; omnipotent. <i>I swear by <b>almighty</b> God.</i>
<b>bible</b>	The sacred writings of the Christian religions.

<b>blaspheme</b>	Utter obscenities or profanities. <i><b>Blaspheme</b> God.</i>
<b>blessed</b>	Roman Catholic proclaimed one of the blessed and thus worthy of veneration. <i>A <b>blessed</b> time.</i>
<b>consecrate</b>	Dedicate to a deity by a vow. <i>The <b>consecrated</b> chapel.</i>
<b><u>creator</u></b>	A person or thing that brings something into existence. <i>James Bond s <b>creator</b> Ian Fleming.</i>
<b>deification</b>	An embodiment of the qualities of a god. <i>The capitalists <b>deification</b> of capital.</i>
<b>deist</b>	Of or relating to deism.
<b>deity</b>	The creator and supreme being (in a monotheistic religion such as Christianity). <i>A <b>deity</b> of ancient Greece.</i>
<b><u>divine</u></b>	Resulting from divine providence. <i>Her pies were simply <b>divine</b>.</i>
<b><u>divinity</u></b>	White creamy fudge made with egg whites. <i>A doctor of <b>divinity</b>.</i>
<b>ecclesiastical</b>	Of or associated with a church (especially a Christian Church). <i>The <b>ecclesiastical</b> hierarchy.</i>
<b>enshrine</b>	Preserve (a right, tradition, or idea) in a form that ensures it will be protected and respected. <i>The right of all workers to strike was <b>enshrined</b> in the new constitution.</i>
<b>godly</b>	Emanating from God. <i>Leading a <b>godly</b> life.</i>
<b>hallowed</b>	Worthy of religious veneration. <i><b>Hallowed</b> ground.</i>
<b><u>heavenly</u></b>	Of the heavens or sky. <i><b>Heavenly</b> constellations.</i>
<b>liturgy</b>	A religious service conducted according to a liturgy. <i>At the conclusion of the <b>liturgy</b> the Bishop presented the certificates.</i>
<b>omnipotent</b>	Having unlimited power. <i>God is described as <b>omnipotent</b> and benevolent.</i>
<b>omniscience</b>	The state of knowing everything. <i>The notion of divine <b>omniscience</b>.</i>
<b>orison</b>	A prayer.

<b>pantheon</b>	A temple to all the gods. <i>The deities of the Hindu <b>pantheon</b>.</i>
<b>paradise</b>	An ideal or idyllic place or state. <i>Martyrs who die in battle with the ungodly earn instant transmission to <b>paradise</b>.</i>
<b>sacred</b>	Made or declared or believed to be holy; devoted to a deity or some religious ceremony or use. <i>A private office <b>sacred</b> to the President.</i>
<b>sacrosanct</b>	(especially of a principle, place, or routine) regarded as too important or valuable to be interfered with. <i>The individual's right to work has been upheld as <b>sacrosanct</b>.</i>
<b>scripture</b>	The sacred writings of Christianity contained in the Bible. <i>Passages of <b>scripture</b>.</i>
<b>theologian</b>	A person who engages or is an expert in theology.
<b>theological</b>	Of or relating to or concerning theology. <i>A reworking of the past that was partly <b>theological</b>.</i>
<b>theology</b>	A particular system or school of religious beliefs and teachings. <i>Jewish <b>theology</b>.</i>
<b>worship</b>	The activity of worshipping. <i><b>Worship</b> of the Mother Goddess.</i>
