## Associations of "On all fours" (30 Words)

<b>always</b>	At all times; all the time and on every occasion. <i>Isabel had <b>always</b> been in rude health.</i>
<b>amount</b>	Be tantamount or equivalent to. <i>The substance is harmless if taken in small <b>amounts</b>.</i>
<b>collectively</b>	As a group; as a whole. <i>The audience <b>collectively</b> winced.</i>
<b>entire</b>	Constituting the undiminished entirety lacking nothing essential especially not damaged. <i>My plans are to travel the <b>entire</b> world.</i>
<b>entirely</b>	Completely (often used for emphasis). <i>Eight coaches <b>entirely</b> for passenger transport.</i>
<b>entirety</b>	The state of being total and complete. <i>He read the article in its <b>entirety</b>.</i>
<b>every</b>	Each and all of a series of entities or intervals as specified. <i><b>Every</b> two hours.</i>
<b>five</b>	A playing card or a domino or a die whose upward face shows five pips.
<b>foursome</b>	A golf match between two pairs of players, with partners playing the same ball. <i>The <b>foursome</b> teed off before 9 a m.</i>
<b>generic</b>	Applicable to an entire class or group. <i>Chvre is a <b>generic</b> term for all goat s milk cheese.</i>
<b>hexad</b>	The cardinal number that is the sum of five and one. <i>Each segment down to the tiniest <b>hexad</b> of cilia is practically identical in shape.</i>
<b>million</b>	(in Roman numerals, M written with a macron over it) denoting a quantity consisting of 1,000,000 items or units. <i>There were <b>millions</b> of flies.</i>

<b>numeral</b>	A symbol used to represent a number. <i>He learned to write the <b>numerals</b> before he went to school.</i>
<b>outright</b>	Directly or openly. <i>An <b>outright</b> victory.</i>
<b>quadruple</b>	A quadruple number or amount. <i>A <b>quadruple</b> vodka.</i>
<b>quartet</b>	A composition for a quartet. <i>A Beethoven <b>quartet</b>.</i>
<b>sextet</b>	A composition for a sextet. <i>The Jazz Club presents a new <b>sextet</b>.</i>
<b>sextuple</b>	Having six units or components.
<b>six</b>	A playing card or domino or die whose upward face shows six pips.
<b>sum</b>	Determine the sum of. <i>He borrowed a large <b>sum</b>.</i>
<b>tally</b>	An account kept by means of a tally. <i>Their first <b>tally</b> came in the 3rd inning.</i>
<b>tertiary</b>	Denoting or relating to carnivores that eat other carnivores and omnivores. <i>Patients in <b>tertiary</b> care.</i>
<b>third</b>	The base that must be touched third by a base runner in baseball. <i>You shouldn't try to start in <b>third</b> gear.</i>
<b>three</b>	One of four playing cards in a deck having three pips.
<b>total</b>	Damage beyond the point of repair. <i>A <b>total</b> failure.</i>
<b>totally</b>	Used to emphasize a clause or statement. <i>A <b>totally</b> new situation.</i>
<b>trinity</b>	Three people considered as a unit. <i>God is said to be <b>trinity</b> in unity.</i>
<b>triple</b>	Hit a triple. <i>A <b>triple</b> murder.</i>
<b>whole</b>	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent whole is often used informally for wholly. <i>Owls usually swallow their prey <b>whole</b>.</i>
<b>wholly</b>	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent whole is often used informally for wholly. <i>The distinction is not <b>wholly</b> clear.</i>
