## Associations of "On the flip side" (30 Words)

<b>abut</b>	Touch or lean on. <i>Masonry may crumble where a roof <b>abuts</b> it.</i>
<b>adjoin</b>	Be in direct physical contact with; make contact. <i>To them were <b>adjoined</b> branches of trees.</i>
<b>aide</b>	Someone who acts as assistant. <i>A presidential <b>aide</b>.</i>
<b>bevel</b>	Cut a bevel on shape to a bevel. <i><b>Bevel</b> the surface.</i>
<b>bluntness</b>	Without sharpness or clearness of edge or point. <i>The <b>bluntness</b> of a Yorkshireman.</i>
<b>dice</b>	Play dice. <i>Cut the meat into <b>dice</b>.</i>
<b>edge</b>	Provide with an edge. <i>The cliff <b>edge</b>.</i>
<b>facet</b>	Any of the individual units (ommatidia) that make up the compound eye of an insect or crustacean. <i>A blue and green jewel that shines from a million <b>facets</b>.</i>
<b>flank</b>	A cut of meat from the flank of an animal. <i>Cherry red sofas <b>flanked</b> the enormous fireplace.</i>
<b>fling</b>	The act of flinging. <i><b>Fling</b> the frisbee.</i>
<b>incline</b>	An inclined surface connecting two levels. <i>He was <b>inclined</b> to accept the offer.</i>
<b>lateral</b>	Involving lateral thinking. <i><b>Lateral</b> lemniscus.</i>
<b>laterally</b>	In a way that involves lateral thinking. <i>Use slide steps to move <b>laterally</b>.</i>

<b>lean</b>	Cause to lean or incline. <i>He <b>leaned</b> his rifle against the wall.</i>
<b>left</b>	On or to the left side. <i>Jab with your <b>left</b>.</i>
<b>marginal</b>	(of a parliamentary or council seat) held by a small majority and therefore at risk in an election. <i><b>Marginal</b> industries.</i>
<b>mutable</b>	Tending to undergo genetic mutation. <i>The <b>mutable</b> nature of fashion.</i>
<b>nearby</b>	Not far away; close. <i>His four sisters live <b>nearby</b>.</i>
<b>perpendicular</b>	Perpendicular position or direction. <i>Houses seem to cling by blind faith to the <b>perpendicular</b> hillside.</i>
<b>quadrilateral</b>	A four-sided figure.
<b>reversible</b>	(of a reaction) occurring together with its converse, and so yielding an equilibrium mixture of reactants and products. <i>A <b>reversible</b> duvet cover.</i>
<b>revocable</b>	Capable of being revoked or cancelled. <i>A <b>revocable</b> order.</i>
<b>revoke</b>	The mistake of not following suit when able to do so. <i>The men appealed and the sentence was <b>revoked</b>.</i>
<b>stoop</b>	Bend one's back forward from the waist on down. <i>The eagle <b>stooped</b> on the mice in the field.</i>
<b>tend</b>	Have a tendency or disposition to do or be something be inclined. <i>She <b>tends</b> to the children.</i>
<b>throw</b>	An act of throwing something. <i><b>Throw</b> accusations at someone.</i>
<b>tilt</b>	A combat between two mounted knights tilting against each other with blunted lances. <i>Pans and <b>tilts</b>.</i>
<b>toss</b>	The action of tossing a coin as a method of deciding which team has the right to make a particular decision at the beginning of a game. <i>Tempest <b>tossed</b> and shipwrecked mariners.</i>
<b>verge</b>	Be very close or similar to. <i>They came down to the <b>verge</b> of the lake.</i>
<b>yaw</b>	Swerve off course momentarily. <i>The <b>yawing</b> motion of the ship.</i>
