altitude	The height of an object or point in relation to sea level or ground level. <i>Flight data including airspeed and altitude.</i>
apex	The highest point (of something). <i>The apex of the roof.</i>
apical	(of a consonant) formed with the tip of the tongue at or near the front teeth or the alveolar ridge, for example th or trilled r.
apogee	The highest point in the development of something; a climax or culmination. <i>A film which was the apogee of German expressionist cinema.</i>
crest	Have attached at the top. <i>A large game bird with a conspicuous erect red crest.</i>
elevated	Of high moral or intellectual value elevated in nature or style. <i>These parish gentry were conscious of their elevated status.</i>
elevation	A scale drawing showing the vertical projection of one side of a building. <i>The area has a topography that ranges from 1 500 to 3 000 metres in elevation.</i>
forefront	The position of greatest importance or advancement; the leading position in any movement or field. <i>The Cotswolds were once at the forefront of woollen manufacturing in England.</i>
height	The vertical dimension of extension; distance from the base of something to the top. <i>The height of the tourist season.</i>
high	In or to a high position amount or degree. <i>A high incline.</i>
ladder	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>He climbed the career ladder.</i>

lid	An eyelid. <i>He raised the piano lid.</i>
lofty	Of imposing height; especially standing out above others. <i>A noble and lofty concept.</i>
maximum	A maximum permitted custodial sentence for an offence. <i>An offence which carries a maximum of 14 years.</i>
meridian	Relating to or situated at a meridian. <i>The meridian moon.</i>
minaret	Slender tower with balconies.
peak	The highest point (of something). <i>The disease peaked in summer.</i>
pinnacle	Summit with a pinnacle. <i>He had reached the pinnacle of his career.</i>
plateau	Reach a state of little or no change after a period of activity or progress. <i>The peace process had reached a plateau.</i>
raised	Embellished with a raised pattern created by pressure or embroidery. <i>Raised needlework.</i>
rung	A crosspiece between the legs of a chair. <i>We must ensure that the low skilled do not get trapped on the bottom rung.</i>
stepladder	A folding portable ladder hinged at the top.
summit	Reach the summit of a mountain or hill. <i>Two binding treaties were agreed at the summit.</i>
superlative	The superlative form of an adjective or adverb. <i>The critics ran out of superlatives to describe him.</i>
towering	Of imposing height; especially standing out above others. <i>A majestic towering album.</i>
unsurpassed	Better or greater than any other. <i>The quality of workmanship is unsurpassed.</i>
up	Upstairs. <i>Miranda hardly ever got up for breakfast.</i>
upper	A central nervous system stimulant that increases energy and decreases appetite; used to treat narcolepsy and some forms of depression. <i>Leather uppers.</i>
zenith	The time at which something is most powerful or successful. <i>The sun was well past the zenith.</i>
