<a href="#">acme</a>	The highest level or degree attainable; the highest stage of development. <i>Physics is the <b>acme</b> of scientific knowledge.</i>
<b>altitude</b>	Great height. <i>Flight data including airspeed and <b>altitude</b>.</i>
<a href="#">apex</a>	The point on the celestial sphere toward which the sun and solar system appear to be moving relative to the fixed stars. <i>The <b>apex</b> of his career was in 1966 when he hoisted aloft the World Cup for England.</i>
<b>apical</b>	Situated at an apex.
<b>apogee</b>	The highest point in the development of something; a climax or culmination. <i>A film which was the <b>apogee</b> of German expressionist cinema.</i>
<b>crest</b>	A distinctive device representing a family or corporate body, borne above the shield of a coat of arms (originally as worn on a helmet) or separately reproduced, for example on writing paper. <i>A high wave formed by the meeting of two <b>crests</b>.</i>
<b>elevated</b>	Of high moral or intellectual value elevated in nature or style Oliver Franks. <i>An <b>elevated</b> temperature.</i>
<a href="#">elevation</a>	The action or fact of raising or being raised to a higher or more important level, state, or position. <i>There was snow at the higher <b>elevations</b>.</i>
<a href="#">forefront</a>	The part in the front or nearest the viewer. <i>The Cotswolds were once at the <b>forefront</b> of woollen manufacturing in England.</i>
<a href="#">height</a>	An extreme example of something. <i>Her <b>height</b> marked her out from other women.</i>
<b>high</b>	A high frequency sound or musical note. <i>A palace <b>high</b> up on a hill.</i>

<b>ladder</b>	With reference to tights or stockings develop or cause to develop a ladder. <i>I <b>laddered</b> my tights as I arrived this morning.</i>
<b>lid</b>	An eyelid. <i>Eyes hooded beneath heavy <b>lids</b>.</i>
<b>lofty</b>	Of high moral or intellectual value; elevated in nature or style- Oliver Franks. <i><b>Lofty</b> intellectual disdain.</i>
<b>maximum</b>	A maximum permitted custodial sentence for an offence. <i>The table has a length of 4 feet <b>maximum</b>.</i>
<b>meridian</b>	Relating to or situated at a meridian. <i>At the end of February Jupiter transits the <b>meridian</b> due south at 6 15 a m.</i>
<b>minaret</b>	A slender tower, typically part of a mosque, with a balcony from which a muezzin calls Muslims to prayer.
<b>peak</b>	The period of greatest prosperity or productivity. <i>Summer was at its <b>peak</b>.</i>
<b>pinnacle</b>	Surmount with a pinnacle. <i>Catapulted Einstein to the <b>pinnacle</b> of fame.</i>
<b>plateau</b>	Reach a state of little or no change after a period of activity or progress. <i>The industry s problems have <b>plateaued</b> out.</i>
<b>raised</b>	Embellished with a raised pattern created by pressure or embroidery. <i><b>Raised</b> needlework.</i>
<b>rung</b>	One of the crosspieces that form the steps of a ladder. <i>We must ensure that the low skilled do not get trapped on the bottom <b>rung</b>.</i>
<b>stepladder</b>	A short folding ladder with flat steps and a small platform.
<b>summit</b>	Reach the summit of a mountain or hill. <i>A <b>summit</b> meeting.</i>
<b>superlative</b>	A superlative adjective or adverb. <i>Fastest is the <b>superlative</b> of the adjective fast.</i>
<b>towering</b>	Of great importance or influence. <i>A majestic <b>towering</b> album.</i>
<b>unsurpassed</b>	Better or greater than any other. <i>The quality of workmanship is <b>unsurpassed</b>.</i>
<b>up</b>	Raise or pick up something. <i>She turned the volume <b>up</b>.</i>
<b>upper</b>	The higher of two berths. <i>The <b>upper</b> half of the class.</i>

**zenith**

The point above the observer that is directly opposite the nadir on the imaginary sphere against which celestial bodies appear to be projected.  
*The sun was well past the **zenith**.*
