## Associations of "Once again" (30 Words)

<b>alliteration</b>	The occurrence of the same letter or sound at the beginning of adjacent or closely connected words. <i>The <b>alliteration</b> of sweet birds sang.</i>
<b>biannual</b>	Occurring or payable twice each year. <i>The <b>biannual</b> meeting of the planning committee.</i>
<b>colonnade</b>	A row of trees or other tall objects.
<b>continual</b>	Continual meaning seemingly uninterrupted is often used interchangeably with continuous meaning without interruption. <i><b>Continual</b> is often used interchangeably with continuous.</i>
<b>daily</b>	Every day; without missing a day. <i>A <b>daily</b> paper.</i>
<b>double</b>	A double measure of spirits. <i>Two whiskies and make it <b>doubles</b> please.</i>
<b>doubled</b>	Twice as great or many. <i>The dose is <b>doubled</b>.</i>
<b>doubly</b>	Two times or in two ways. <i>He was <b>doubly</b> wrong.</i>
<b>dual</b>	In an aircraft using dual controls. <i>A double or <b>dual</b> role for an actor.</i>
<b>multiple</b>	A number that may be divided by another a certain number of times without a remainder. <i><b>Multiple</b> birth.</i>
<b>oft</b>	Many times at short intervals. <i>An <b>oft</b> quoted tenet.</i>
<b>overexertion</b>	Excessive exertion; so much exertion that discomfort or injury results.
<b>perennial</b>	A perennial plant. <i>Spring streams rise from <b>perennial</b> springs.</i>

<b><u>periodic</u></b>	Relating to the periodic table of the elements. <i>The <b>periodic</b> appearance of the seventeen year locust.</i>
<b><u>recurrent</u></b>	Occurring often or repeatedly. <i>The <b>recurrent</b> nerve leaves the hypocerebral ganglion.</i>
<b>redouble</b>	A call that doubles a bid already doubled by an opponent. <i>The screaming <b>redoubled</b>.</i>
<b>regular</b>	One of the regular clergy. <i>A <b>regular</b> verb.</i>
<b>reiterate</b>	Say something again or a number of times, typically for emphasis or clarity. <i>She <b>reiterated</b> that the government would remain steadfast in its support.</i>
<b><u>repeat</u></b>	Repeat an earlier theme of a composition. <i>He <b>repeated</b> the words after me.</i>
<b>repeated</b>	Done or occurring again several times in the same way. <i>There were <b>repeated</b> attempts to negotiate.</i>
<b>repeating</b>	(of a pattern) recurring uniformly over a surface.
<b>repetition</b>	The action of repeating something that has already been said or written. <i>The tune is full of melodic <b>repetition</b> and sequence.</i>
<b><u>reprise</u></b>	Repeat an earlier theme of a composition. <i>He <b>reprises</b> his role as the vigilante architect.</i>
<b><u>restate</u></b>	State (something) again or differently, especially more clearly or convincingly. <i>He <b>restated</b> his opposition to abortion.</i>
<b>review</b>	Hold a review of troops. <i>The Director General s end of year <b>review</b>.</i>
<b>tautology</b>	(logic) a statement that is necessarily true. <i>To say that something is <i>adequate enough</i> is a <b>tautology</b>.</i>
<b><u>times</u></b>	A more or less definite period of time now or previously present. <i>It was a sign of the <b>times</b>.</i>
<b>twice</b>	To double the degree. <i>The earl married <b>twice</b>.</i>
<b>twofold</b>	Twice as great or as numerous. <i>The <b>twofold</b> demands of the business and motherhood.</i>
<b><u>weekly</u></b>	Relating to or calculated in terms of a week. <i>The difference in <b>weekly</b> income is 29 10.</i>
