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Associations of "Onomatopoeia" (30 Words)

accent	Put stress on utter with an accent. <i>The accent is on participation.</i>
alliteration	The occurrence of the same letter or sound at the beginning of adjacent or closely connected words. <i>Alliterations are clustered in the last few lines.</i>
assonance	Resemblance of sound between syllables of nearby words, arising particularly from the rhyming of two or more stressed vowels, but not consonants (e.g. sonnet, porridge), but also from the use of identical consonants with different vowels (e.g. killed, cold, culled). <i>Alliterative assonances such as fail and fall are very common in Old English poetry.</i>
audible	Able to be heard. <i>Some ultrasound is audible to dogs.</i>
audio	A recording of acoustic signals. <i>They always raise the audio for commercials.</i>
bang	Leap jerk bang. <i>She was banging around the kitchen.</i>
bell	Each of the eight half hour units of nautical time signaled by strokes of a ship's bell eight bells signals 4 00 8 00 or 12 00 o'clock either a.m. or p.m. <i>A flower with small pale blue bells.</i>
crackle	Having the surface decorated with a network of fine cracks as in crackleware. <i>The fire suddenly crackled and spat sparks.</i>
diction	The manner in which something is expressed in words. <i>Wordsworth campaigned against exaggerated poetic diction.</i>
ding	Go ding dong like a bell. <i>Cash registers were dinging softly.</i>

dubbing	Material used for the bodies of artificial fishing flies, especially fur or wool on waxed silk.
echo	Ring or echo with sound. <i>The flower arrangement was created as an echo of a client's still life.</i>
hear	Examine or hear evidence or a case by judicial process. <i>We must hear the expert before we make a decision.</i>
hearing	The act of hearing attentively. <i>I think I had a fair hearing.</i>
hiss	Express or utter with a hiss. <i>He was hissed off the stage.</i>
homophonic	Characterized by the movement of accompanying parts in the same rhythm as the melody.
impersonate	Pretend to be someone you are not; sometimes with fraudulent intentions. <i>It's a very serious offence to impersonate a police officer.</i>
jingle	A light ringing sound such as that made by metal objects being shaken together. <i>He makes up advertising jingles.</i>
language	Coarse or offensive language. <i>He taught foreign languages.</i>
lexicon	The vocabulary of a person, language, or branch of knowledge. <i>A Greek Latin lexicon.</i>
loud	Used chiefly as a direction or description in music loud with force. <i>A man in a loud checked suit.</i>
phonetic	Relating to phonetics. <i>A phonetic alphabet.</i>
ping	Hit with a pinging noise. <i>The car pinged when I put in low octane gasoline.</i>
pronunciation	The way a word or a language is customarily spoken. <i>Similar pronunciations are heard in Ulster.</i>
rhyme	Of a poem or song be composed in rhyme. <i>Hat and cat rhyme.</i>
sound	Measure the depth of a body of water with a sounding line. <i>He has a sound understanding of the law.</i>
tap	Make light repeated taps on a surface. <i>Tap a source of money.</i>
vocabulary	A range of artistic or stylistic forms, techniques, or movements. <i>He introduced a wide vocabulary of techniques.</i>

vocal

Used in the production of speech sounds.
*Non linguistic **vocal** effects like laughs and sobs.*

word

The divine word of God the second person in the Trinity incarnate in Jesus.
*Someone gave me the **word** to start playing.*
