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## Associations of "Onomatopoeia" (30 Words)

<a href="#">accent</a>	Put stress on utter with an accent. <i>The <b>accent</b> is on participation.</i>
<b>alliteration</b>	The occurrence of the same letter or sound at the beginning of adjacent or closely connected words. <i><b>Alliterations</b> are clustered in the last few lines.</i>
<b>assonance</b>	Resemblance of sound between syllables of nearby words, arising particularly from the rhyming of two or more stressed vowels, but not consonants (e.g. sonnet, porridge), but also from the use of identical consonants with different vowels (e.g. killed, cold, culled). <i>Alliterative <b>assonances</b> such as fail and fall are very common in Old English poetry.</i>
<a href="#">audible</a>	Able to be heard. <i>Some ultrasound is <b>audible</b> to dogs.</i>
<a href="#">audio</a>	A recording of acoustic signals. <i>They always raise the <b>audio</b> for commercials.</i>
<b>bang</b>	Leap jerk bang. <i>She was <b>banging</b> around the kitchen.</i>
<b>bell</b>	Each of the eight half hour units of nautical time signaled by strokes of a ship's bell eight bells signals 4 00 8 00 or 12 00 o'clock either a.m. or p.m. <i>A flower with small pale blue <b>bells</b>.</i>
<b>crackle</b>	Having the surface decorated with a network of fine cracks as in crackleware. <i>The fire suddenly <b>crackled</b> and spat sparks.</i>
<b>diction</b>	The manner in which something is expressed in words. <i>Wordsworth campaigned against exaggerated poetic <b>diction</b>.</i>
<b>ding</b>	Go ding dong like a bell. <i>Cash registers were <b>dinging</b> softly.</i>

<b>dubbing</b>	Material used for the bodies of artificial fishing flies, especially fur or wool on waxed silk.
<b>echo</b>	Ring or echo with sound. <i>The flower arrangement was created as an <b>echo</b> of a client's still life.</i>
<b>hear</b>	Examine or hear evidence or a case by judicial process. <i>We must <b>hear</b> the expert before we make a decision.</i>
<b>hearing</b>	The act of hearing attentively. <i>I think I had a fair <b>hearing</b>.</i>
<b>hiss</b>	Express or utter with a hiss. <i>He was <b>hissed</b> off the stage.</i>
<b>homophonic</b>	Characterized by the movement of accompanying parts in the same rhythm as the melody.
<b>impersonate</b>	Pretend to be someone you are not; sometimes with fraudulent intentions. <i>It's a very serious offence to <b>impersonate</b> a police officer.</i>
<b>jingle</b>	A light ringing sound such as that made by metal objects being shaken together. <i>He makes up advertising <b>jingles</b>.</i>
<b>language</b>	Coarse or offensive language. <i>He taught foreign <b>languages</b>.</i>
<b>lexicon</b>	The vocabulary of a person, language, or branch of knowledge. <i>A Greek Latin <b>lexicon</b>.</i>
<b>loud</b>	Used chiefly as a direction or description in music loud with force. <i>A man in a <b>loud</b> checked suit.</i>
<b>phonetic</b>	Relating to phonetics. <i>A <b>phonetic</b> alphabet.</i>
<b>ping</b>	Hit with a pinging noise. <i>The car <b>pinged</b> when I put in low octane gasoline.</i>
<b>pronunciation</b>	The way a word or a language is customarily spoken. <i>Similar <b>pronunciations</b> are heard in Ulster.</i>
<b>rhyme</b>	Of a poem or song be composed in rhyme. <i>Hat and cat <b>rhyme</b>.</i>
<b>sound</b>	Measure the depth of a body of water with a sounding line. <i>He has a <b>sound</b> understanding of the law.</i>
<b>tap</b>	Make light repeated taps on a surface. <i><b>Tap</b> a source of money.</i>
<b>vocabulary</b>	A range of artistic or stylistic forms, techniques, or movements. <i>He introduced a wide <b>vocabulary</b> of techniques.</i>

**vocal**

Used in the production of speech sounds.  
*Non linguistic **vocal** effects like laughs and sobs.*

**word**

The divine word of God the second person in the Trinity incarnate in Jesus.  
*Someone gave me the **word** to start playing.*
