doubtful Not established as genuine or acceptable.

They were **doubtful** that the cord would hold.

dubious Hesitating or doubting.

Timeshare has been brought into disrepute by **dubious** sales methods.

(of speech or writing) using or involving ellipsis, especially so as to be

**elliptical** difficult to understand.

**Elliptical** colloquial exchanges.

Resembling an oracle in obscurity of thought.

**enigmatic** I didn t grasp the meaning of that **enigmatic** comment until much

later.

equivocal

Uncertain or questionable in nature.

An **equivocal** response to an embarrassing question.

**esoteric** Confined to and understandable by only an enlightened inner circle.

A compilation of **esoteric** philosophical theories.

filmy So thin as to transmit light.

**Filmy** wings of a moth.

Indistinct or hazy in outline.

She was **foggy** with sleep.

**grimy** Covered with or characterized by grime.

The **grimy** industrial city.

Indistinct or hazy in outline.

The picture we have of him is extremely **hazy**.



hidden Kept out of sight; concealed.

**Hidden** valleys.

**impenetrable** Impossible to pass through or enter.

An **impenetrable** fortress.

incomprehensible Incapable of being explained or accounted for.

A language which is **incomprehensible** to anyone outside the office.

indefinite Not clearly expressed or defined; vague.

Were **indefinite** about their plans.

indeterminate Not exactly known, established, or defined.

The date of manufacture is **indeterminate**.

indistinct Not clearly defined or easy to perceive or understand.

Only **indistinct** notions of what to do.

inexplicable Incapable of being explained or accounted for.

For some **inexplicable** reason her mind went completely blank.

(of a colour) not bright; soft.

misty A misty pink.

muddied (of color) discolored by impurities; not bright and clear.

The **muddied** grey of the sea.

Discolored by impurities; not bright and clear is often used in

**muddy** combination.

The original colours were blurred into **muddy** pink and yellow.

mysterious

In its mysterious past it encompasses all the dim origins of life.

nebulous Lacking definite form or limits.

A giant **nebulous** glow.

Neither parallel nor at right angles to a specified or implied line;

**oblique** slanting.

He issued an **oblique** attack on the President.

**obscure** Not drawing attention.

A relatively **obscure** actor.

oracular Resembling an oracle in obscurity of thought.

He holds forth in **oracular** fashion.

**perplexing**Lacking clarity of meaning; causing confusion or perplexity.

**Perplexing** to someone who knew nothing about it.

hazy Indistinct or hazy in outline.

**Hazy** memories.

**incoherent** Unable to express yourself clearly or fluently.

A turgid **incoherent** presentation.

inconspicuous

Not prominent or readily noticeable.

He pushed the string through an **inconspicuous** hole.

indefinite Vague or not clearly defined or stated.

Were indefinite about their plans.

indistinct Not clear or sharply defined.

An **indistinct** memory.

Of a number quantity or expression not expressible as a ratio of two integers and having an infinite and non recurring expansion when

<u>irrational</u> expressed as a decimal Examples of irrational numbers are the number
