Associations of "Open up" (30 Words)

ascend	(of a voice or sound) rise in pitch. <i>The path ascended to the top of the hill.</i>
ascending	Sloping or leading upwards. <i>The ascending stems of chickweed.</i>
ascent	An instance of rising or moving up through the air. <i>The first ascent of the Matterhorn.</i>
bald	Grow bald lose hair on one s head. <i>Hedgehogs are born bald.</i>
<u>bare</u>	Just barely adequate or within a lower limit. <i>He outlined the bare essentials of the story.</i>
boost	Give a boost to be beneficial to. <i>The tax cut will boost the economy.</i>
<u>climb</u>	A mountain hill or slope that is climbed. <i>We decided to climb to 6 000 feet.</i>
<u>climbing</u>	The sport or activity of climbing mountains or cliffs. <i>Climbing equipment.</i>
<u>elevate</u>	Raise to a more important or impressive level. <i>The exercise will naturally elevate your chest and head.</i>
elevator	A platform or compartment housed in a shaft for raising and lowering people or things to different levels; a lift. <i>In the harbour a giant elevator stores prairie grain.</i>
escalator	A moving staircase consisting of an endlessly circulating belt of steps driven by a motor, which conveys people between the floors of a public building.
exposed	With no protection or shield. <i>The trail is level but very exposed best on a mild day.</i>
grow	Allow or cause a part of the body to grow or develop. <i>Her hair doesn t grow much anymore.</i>

lift	Lifting device consisting of a platform or cage that is raised and lowered mechanically in a vertical shaft in order to move people from one floor to another in a building. <i>The lift door opened.</i>
precipitate	A substance precipitated from a solution. <i>The crisis precipitated by Russia's revolution.</i>
raise	Raise in rank or condition. <i>Raise the roof.</i>
rise	Rise in rank or status. <i>I try to rise above prejudice.</i>
risen	Above the horizon. <i>The risen sun.</i>
rising	Advancing to maturity or high standing. <i>A rising trend.</i>
soar	Rise rapidly. <i>The stock market soared after the cease fire was announced.</i>
stairs	A flight of stairs or a flight of steps.
stepladder	A folding portable ladder hinged at the top.
toupee	A small artificial hairpiece worn to cover a bald spot.
unaided	Carried out without aid or assistance. <i>She can no longer walk unaided.</i>
uphill	The upward slope of a hill. <i>He gave mountain biking clinics on handling steep uphills.</i>
upstairs	The part of a building above the ground floor. <i>I tiptoed upstairs.</i>
upward	Directed up. <i>The fragments flew upwards.</i>
vertically	At right angles to a horizontal plane; aligned in such a way that the top is directly above the bottom. <i>The wheel hangs vertically from a wire.</i>
zoom	Cause a lens or camera to zoom in or out. <i>The value of these stocks is zooming.</i>
