Associations of "Opened my eyes" (30 Words)

aesthetics	A set of principles concerned with the nature and appreciation of beauty. <i>Traditional aesthetics assumed the existence of universal and timeless criteria of artistic value.</i>
askance	With a side or oblique glance. <i>A waiter looked askance at his jeans.</i>
behold	See or observe (someone or something, especially of remarkable or impressive nature). <i>Behold your lord and prince.</i>
eyelid	Either of two folds of skin that can be moved to cover or open the eye.
farsighted	Able to see distant objects clearly. <i>Large goals that required farsighted policies.</i>
gaze	A steady intent look. <i>He turned following her gaze.</i>
glance	Throw a glance at take a brief look at. <i>I stole a glance at John.</i>
leer	Look or gaze in a lascivious or unpleasant way. <i>The men leered at the young women on the beach.</i>
look	Of a building or room have an outlook in a specified direction. <i>The government should take a look at the amount of grant the council receives.</i>
macroscopic	Visible to the naked eye; using the naked eye.
observing	Quick to notice; showing quick and keen perception.
ocular	Relating to or using sight. <i>An ocular spot is a pigmented organ or part believed to be sensitive to light.</i>
optic	A lens or other optical component in an optical instrument. <i>An optical illusion.</i>

optical	(of a device) requiring electromagnetic radiation for its operation. <i>An optical aid.</i>
peek	A secret look. <i>His socks were so full of holes his toes peeked through.</i>
perceptual	Relating to the ability to interpret or become aware of something through the senses. <i>A patient with perceptual problems who cannot judge distances.</i>
see	See or watch. <i>I can't see any other way to treat it.</i>
sidelong	Situated at or extending to the side. <i>Shot out sidelong boughs.</i>
sight	Take a detailed visual measurement of something with or as with a sight. <i>He now refused to let Rose out of his sight.</i>
sneer	Smile or speak in a contemptuous or mocking manner. <i>He acknowledged their presence with a condescending sneer.</i>
spectacle	A blunder that makes you look ridiculous used in the phrase make a spectacle of yourself. <i>The show is pure spectacle.</i>
splendor	A quality that outshines the usual. <i>It is the university that gives the scene its stately splendor.</i>
squint	The act of squinting looking with the eyes partly closed. <i>Let me have a squint.</i>
stare	A fixed look with eyes open wide. <i>He stared at her in amazement.</i>
telescope	Crush together or collapse. <i>In the accident the cars telescoped.</i>
telescopic	Visible only with a telescope. <i>A telescopic drinking cup.</i>
visible	Visible imports or exports. <i>A highly visible member of the royal entourage.</i>
vision	The images seen on a television screen. <i>He had a vision of his own death.</i>
visual	Relating to seeing or sight. <i>Colour visuals of today's models.</i>
watch	The officers and crew on duty during a watch. <i>You should watch what you say.</i>
