- *Done or occurring at a favourable time; well timed.*
- *(of a time) especially convenient or appropriate for a particular action or event.*



## Synonyms of "Opportune" as an adjective (21 Words)

<b>advantageous</b>	Appropriate for achieving a particular end; implies a lack of concern for fairness. <i>Socially <b>advantageous</b> to entertain often.</i>
<b>auspicious</b>	Auguring favorable circumstances and good luck. <i>An <b>auspicious</b> beginning for the campaign.</i>
<b>beneficial</b>	Resulting in good; favourable or advantageous. <i>The <b>beneficial</b> effect on the economy.</i>
<u><b>benign</b></u>	Gentle and kindly. <i>The climate becomes more <b>benign</b> as we move nearer to the Black Sea.</i>
<u><b>bright</b></u>	Not made dim or less bright. <i>A <b>bright</b> young journalist.</i>
<b>favourable</b>	(of weather, or a period of time judged in terms of its weather) fine. <i>A <b>favourable</b> prognosis.</i>
<b>felicitous</b>	Exhibiting an agreeably appropriate manner or style. <i>A <b>felicitous</b> phrase.</i>
<u><b>fortunate</b></u>	Materially well off; prosperous. <i>It was <b>fortunate</b> that the weather was good.</i>
<b>full of promise</b>	Filled to satisfaction with food or drink.
<u><b>golden</b></u>	Presaging or likely to bring good luck or a good outcome. <i>A <b>golden</b> era.</i>

<b>good</b>	Promoting or enhancing well-being. <i>Now is the time to have a really <b>good</b> clear up.</i>
<b>happy</b>	Enjoying or showing or marked by joy or pleasure. <i>They tended to be <b>happy</b>.</i>
<b>heaven-sent</b>	Peculiarly fortunate or appropriate; as if by divine intervention.
<b>hopeful</b>	Likely to turn out well in the future. <i>A line of people <b>hopeful</b> of obtaining tickets.</i>
<b>lucky</b>	Presaging or likely to bring good luck or a good outcome. <i>A <b>lucky</b> man.</i>
<b>optimistic</b>	(of an estimate) unrealistically high. <i>Took an <b>optimistic</b> view.</i>
<b>promising</b>	Showing possibility of achievement or excellence. <i>The scandal threatened an abrupt end to a <b>promising</b> political career.</i>
<b>propitious</b>	Favourably disposed towards someone. <i><b>Propitious</b> omens.</i>
<b>providential</b>	Resulting from divine providence. <i>His appearance had seemed more than just <b>providential</b>.</i>
<b>right</b>	Socially right or correct. <i>Are you politically <b>right</b> left or centre.</i>
<b>rosy</b>	Promising or suggesting good fortune or happiness; hopeful. <i>A <b>rosy</b> cheeked schoolgirl.</i>

<b>acknowledgement</b>	The expression of gratitude or appreciation for something. <i>The reproduction on page 50 wasn't mentioned in the <b>acknowledgements</b>.</i>
<b><u>affordable</u></b>	Inexpensive; reasonably priced. <i><b>Affordable</b> homes.</i>
<b>applicable</b>	Capable of being applied; having relevance. <i>Gave <b>applicable</b> examples to support her argument.</i>
<b><u>apposite</u></b>	Being of striking appropriateness and pertinence. <i>An <b>apposite</b> quotation.</i>

<b>appropriate</b>	Devote (money or assets) to a special purpose. <i>A book not <b>appropriate</b> for children.</i>
<b>appropriateness</b>	The quality of being suitable or proper in the circumstances. <i>Some staff members question the <b>appropriateness</b> of this practice.</i>
<u><b>apropos</b></u>	Introducing a different topic. <i>The composer's reference to child's play is <b>apropos</b>.</i>
<u><b>apt</b></u>	Having a tendency to do something. <i>An <b>apt</b> reply.</i>
<b>befitting</b>	Appropriate to. <i>A country which can run the prestigious tournament in a <b>befitting</b> manner.</i>
<b>chance</b>	Be the case by chance. <i>There is a <b>chance</b> of winning the raffle.</i>
<b>correct</b>	Make right or correct. <i><b>Correct</b> the alignment of the front wheels.</i>
<u><b>corrective</b></u>	A device for treating injury or disease. <i><b>Corrective</b> lenses.</i>
<b>felicitous</b>	Marked by good fortune. <i>A <b>felicitous</b> life.</i>
<b>germane</b>	Relevant to a subject under consideration. <i>That is not <b>germane</b> to our theme.</i>
<b>incidentally</b>	Of a minor or subordinate nature. <i>These magnificent achievements were only <b>incidentally</b> influenced by Oriental models.</i>
<u><b>just</b></u>	Of an opinion or appraisal well founded justifiable. <i>We were <b>just</b> finishing breakfast.</i>
<b>licit</b>	Not forbidden; lawful. <i>Usage patterns differ between <b>licit</b> and <b>illicit</b> drugs.</i>
<b>likely</b>	Likely but not certain to be or become true or real. <i>A <b>likely</b> place for a restaurant.</i>
<b>pertinence</b>	Relevance by virtue of being applicable to the matter at hand.
<b>pertinent</b>	Being of striking appropriateness and pertinence. <i>Practitioners must consider all factors <b>pertinent</b> to a situation.</i>
<u><b>prone</b></u>	With a downward slope or direction. <i>Farmed fish are <b>prone</b> to disease.</i>
<b>proper</b>	Belonging to oneself or itself; own. <i>A very prim and <b>proper</b> Swiss lady.</i>

punctual

Denoting or relating to an action that takes place at a particular point in time.

*He s the sort of man who s always **punctual**.*

relevance

The quality or state of being closely connected or appropriate.

*The quantity quality and **relevance** of links count towards your rating.*

relevant

Having a bearing on or connection with the subject at issue.

*Critics may find themselves unable to stay **relevant** in a changing world.*

**right**

A right turn.

*Hit him with quick **rights** to the body.*

**rightness**

Conformity with some esthetic standard of correctness or propriety.

*They argue for the moral **rightness** of overthrowing the leader by force.*

**ripe**

(of a cheese or wine) fully matured.

*The **ripe** age of 90.*

**seasonable**

Usual for or appropriate to a particular season of the year.

*A **seasonable** time for discussion.*

timely

Before a time limit expires.

*With **timely** treatment the patient has a good chance of recovery.*
