adversely	In a way that prevents success or development; harmfully or unfavourably. <i>His self confidence was adversely affected for years to come.</i>
antithesis	A person or thing that is the direct opposite of someone or something else. <i>The antithesis between occult and rational mentalities.</i>
antithetical	Directly opposed or contrasted; mutually incompatible. <i>Practices entirely antithetical to her professed beliefs.</i>
backward	(of a fielding position) behind an imaginary line passing through the stumps at the batsman’s end at right angles to the wicket. <i>It s easy to get the i and the e backward in words like seize and siege.</i>
conflicting	In disagreement- John Morley. <i>There are conflicting accounts of what occurred.</i>
contradictory	A contradictory proposition. <i>Politically he exhibited contradictory behaviour.</i>
contrarily	Contrary to expectations.
contrary	A contrary proposition. <i>An Act applies only to the United Kingdom unless the contrary is expressed.</i>
converse	Carry on a conversation. <i>It will be difficult in these converses not to talk of secular matter.</i>
counterpart	A person or thing that corresponds to or has the same function as another person or thing in a different place or situation. <i>The minister held talks with his French counterpart.</i>
diametrical	Related to or along a diameter. <i>Diametrical or opposite points of view.</i>
forerunner	A person who goes before or announces the coming of another. <i>The ice safe was a forerunner of today s refrigerator.</i>

genitive	A word in the genitive case. <i>The genitive endings.</i>
harbinger	A forerunner of something. <i>These works were not yet opera but they were the most important harbinger of opera.</i>
headfirst	With the head foremost. <i>A headfirst plunge down the stairs.</i>
<u>herald</u>	(formal) a person who announces important news. <i>The band have been heralded as the great hope for the nineties.</i>
inverse	Opposite or contrary in position, direction, order, or effect. <i>A term is in inverse proportion to another term if it increases or decreases as the other decreases or increases.</i>
inversion	A transformation in which each point of a given figure is replaced by another point on the same straight line from a fixed point especially in such a way that the product of the distances of the two points from the centre of inversion is constant. <i>Since the company maintains a franchisee model it is a viable target for inversion.</i>
locative	A word in the locative case.
<u>oxymoron</u>	A figure of speech in which apparently contradictory terms appear in conjunction (e.g. faith unfaithful kept him falsely true).
polarity	Having an indicated pole (as the distinction between positive and negative electric charges). <i>It exhibits polarity when presented to a magnetic needle.</i>
<u>preceding</u>	Coming before something in order, position, or time. <i>A growth in sales above those of the preceding year.</i>
<u>precursor</u>	Something that precedes and indicates the approach of something or someone. <i>A three stringed precursor of the violin.</i>
retrograde	Show retrograde motion. <i>Our history must retrograde for the space of a few pages.</i>
reversal	A judgment by a higher court that the judgment of a lower court was incorrect and should be set aside. <i>A reversal by the House of Lords of the Court of Appeal s decision.</i>
reverse	Reverse the position order relation or condition of. <i>The gall actuates a reverse of photosynthesis.</i>
<u>revolutionize</u>	Fill with revolutionary ideas. <i>This fabulous new theory will revolutionize the whole of science.</i>

*He was a **trailblazer** for many ideas that are now standard fare.*
- turnaround** A space for vehicles to turn round in, especially one at the end of a driveway or dead-end street.
