adversely	In an adverse manner. <i>His self confidence was adversely affected for years to come.</i>
antithesis	A person or thing that is the direct opposite of someone or something else. <i>Figures of speech such as antithesis.</i>
antithetic	Sharply contrasted in character or purpose. <i>Practices entirely antithetical to her professed beliefs.</i>
antithetical	Directly opposed or contrasted; mutually incompatible. <i>Practices entirely antithetical to her professed beliefs.</i>
backward	(of a fielding position) behind an imaginary line passing through the stumps at the batsman’s end at right angles to the wicket. <i>It s easy to get the i and the e backward in words like seize and siege.</i>
conflicting	Incompatible or at variance; contradictory. <i>Conflicting opinions.</i>
contradictory	A contradictory proposition. <i>Politically he exhibited contradictory behaviour.</i>
contrarily	Contrary to expectations.
contrary	A contrary proposition. <i>Public opinion to the contrary he is not guilty.</i>
converse	Turned about in order or relation. <i>It will be difficult in these converses not to talk of secular matter.</i>
counterpart	A person or thing having the same function or characteristics as another. <i>The minister held talks with his French counterpart.</i>
diametrical	Related to or along a diameter. <i>He s the diametrical opposite of Gabriel.</i>
headfirst	With the head foremost. <i>A headfirst plunge down the stairs.</i>

inverse	Opposite in nature or effect or relation to another quantity. <i>The age of such a universe is simply the inverse of the Hubble constant.</i>
inversion	A transformation in which each point of a given figure is replaced by another point on the same straight line from a fixed point especially in such a way that the product of the distances of the two points from the centre of inversion is constant. <i>The inversion of the normal domestic arrangement.</i>
locative	The locative case.
negation	A proposition whose assertion specifically denies the truth of another proposition. <i>The negation of A is briefly not A.</i>
opponent	Characterized by active hostility. <i>He beat his opponent by a landslide margin.</i>
opposing	In conflict or competition with someone or something. <i>On the opposing page there were two addresses.</i>
other	Further; additional. <i>The other side of the street.</i>
<u>oxymoron</u>	A figure of speech in which apparently contradictory terms appear in conjunction (e.g. faith unfaithful kept him falsely true).
<u>paradoxical</u>	Seemingly absurd or self-contradictory. <i>It is paradoxical that standing is more tiring than walking.</i>
polarity	The property of having poles or being polar. <i>The magnetic field peaks in strength immediately after switching polarity.</i>
refractive	Capable of changing the direction (of a light or sound wave). <i>The refractive characteristics of the eye.</i>
retrograde	Show retrograde motion. <i>A retrograde flow.</i>
reversal	An annulment of a judgement, sentence, or decree made by a lower court or authority. <i>The champions suffered a League reversal at Gloucester last month.</i>
reverse	The design or inscription on the reverse of a coin or medal. <i>The address is given on the reverse of this leaflet.</i>
<u>revolutionize</u>	Fill with revolutionary ideas. <i>E mail revolutionized communication in academe.</i>
<u>turnaround</u>	A space for vehicles to turn round in, especially one at the end of a driveway or dead-end street. <i>A seven day turnaround.</i>
