The **governor** of the Bank of England.

impinge Impinge or infringe upon.

The proposed fencing would **impinge** on a public bridleway.

infringe
Such widespread surveillance could infringe personal liberties.

A person who becomes involved in a place or situation where they are not

interloper wanted or are considered not to belong.

To her I was always an outsider an **interloper**.

intrude Thrust oneself in as if by force.

They **intrude**d on our dinner party.

Advance beyond the usual limit.

A person who intrudes, especially into a building with criminal intent.

intruder The **intruder** had pulled out drawers and dumped their contents on the

floor.

intrusion Entrance by force or without permission or welcome.

He was furious about this **intrusion** into his private life.

Occupy in large numbers or live on a host.

Demonstrators **invade**d the Presidential Palace.

invader Someone who enters by force in order to conquer.

The arrival of Spanish **invader**s.

invincible Too powerful to be defeated or overcome.

An **invincible** warrior.

monocracy A form of government in which the ruler is an absolute dictator (not

restricted by a constitution or laws or opposition etc.

ruler A person who rules or commands.

satrap A governor of a province in ancient Persia.

A person superior to another in rank or status especially a colleague in a

superior higher position.

Superior officer.

Spread over land, especially along a subsiding shoreline.

trespass Pass beyond (limits or boundaries.

A mass **trespass** on the moor.

tyrant A tyrant flycatcher.

Wrongfully seizing and holding (an office or powers) by force (especially the

usurpation seizure of a throne or supreme authority.

A succession of generals who ruled by **usurpation**.

violate Violate the sacred character of a place or language.

Violate my privacy.

The crime of forcing a person to submit to sexual intercourse against his or

violation her will.
