**foresee**Be aware of beforehand; predict.

We did not **foresee** any difficulties.

**quess**Put forward of a guess in spite of possible refutation.

My **guess** is that within a year we will have a referendum.

An estimate based on little or no information.

**guesswork** Answering this question will involve you in a certain amount of

guesswork.

**hope** A specific instance of feeling hopeful.

In spite of his troubles he never gave up **hope**.

hopeful Full or promise.

Two executive **hopeful**s joined the firm.

Deduce or conclude (something) from evidence and reasoning rather than

**infer** from explicit statements.

From these facts we can **infer** that crime has been increasing.

Extremely.

**positively**Experts could not **positively** identify the voices.

**preconception** A partiality that prevents objective consideration of an issue or situation.

He did not even try to confirm his **preconception**s.

make a prediction about tell in advance.
