Definitions of "Optimize" as a verb

- *Rearrange or rewrite (data, software, etc.) to improve efficiency of retrieval or processing.*
- *Make optimal; get the most out of; use best.*
- *Modify to achieve maximum efficiency in storage capacity or time or cost.*
- *Make the best or most effective use of (a situation or resource).*

<u>ameliorate</u>	Make (something bad or unsatisfactory) better. <i>The reform did much to ameliorate living standards.</i>
augment	Grow or intensify. <i>The pressure augmented.</i>

augmentation	An addition to a coat of arms granted as a mark of special honour. <i>The augmentation of the curriculum with new subjects.</i>
best	To the highest degree; most (used with verbs suggesting a desirable action or state or a successful outcome). <i>The best film of the year.</i>
better	The better one that which is better. <i>His ideas for bettering the lot of the millhands.</i>
choice	An act of choosing between two or more possibilities. <i>You can have a sofa made in a choice of forty fabrics.</i>
develop	Cause to grow and differentiate in ways conforming to its natural development. <i>We must develop more potential customers.</i>
enhance	Increase. <i>This sauce will enhance the flavor of the meat.</i>
enhancement	An improvement that makes something more agreeable. <i>The enhancement of civic amenities.</i>
enlarge	Develop a larger print of (a photograph). <i>They have renovated and enlarged the four storey building.</i>
enrich	Increase the proportion of a particular isotope in (an element), especially that of the isotope U-235 in uranium so as to make it suitable for use in a nuclear reactor or weapon. <i>Her exposure to museums enriched her life in France.</i>
escalate	Make or become more intense or serious. <i>The Allies escalated the bombing.</i>
evolve	(with reference to an organism or biological feature) develop over successive generations as a result of natural selection. <i>Each school must evolve its own way of working.</i>
expansion	The increase in the volume of fuel on combustion in the cylinder of an engine, or the piston stroke in which this occurs. <i>German expansion in the 1930s.</i>
heighten	Increase. <i>The tension heightened.</i>
improve	To make better. <i>Efforts to improve relations between the countries.</i>
improving	Giving moral or intellectual benefit. <i>A large improving picture hung opposite.</i>
increase	The amount by which something increases. <i>The amount of work increased.</i>

increment	A regular increase in salary on an incremental scale. <i>All sizes from 4 30 mm in 1 mm increments.</i>
meliorate	Get better.
<u>optimum</u>	Most favorable conditions or greatest degree or amount possible under given circumstances. <i>The optimum must lie between these two values.</i>
<u>preferable</u>	More desirable or suitable. <i>Lower interest rates were preferable to higher ones.</i>
reelect	Elect again.
sere	(especially of vegetation) dry or withered. <i>The desert was edged with sere vegetation.</i>
<u>surge</u>	A powerful rush of an emotion or feeling. <i>Indignation surged up within her.</i>
<u>tenfold</u>	Having ten parts or elements. <i>A tenfold increase in the use of insecticides.</i>
<u>upgrade</u>	An act of upgrading something. <i>I ve upgraded my computer so I can run better software.</i>
<u>uplift</u>	Support from a garment, especially for a woman's bust. <i>Audiences will be uplifted by this incredible tale of fighting for your dreams.</i>
