### Definitions of "Optimize" as a verb

- *Act as an optimist and take a sunny view of the world.*
- *Rearrange or rewrite (data, software, etc.) to improve efficiency of retrieval or processing.*
- *Make optimal; get the most out of; use best.*
- *Modify to achieve maximum efficiency in storage capacity or time or cost.*
- *Make the best or most effective use of (a situation or resource).*

<b>advance</b>	Pay in advance. <i>I <b>advanced</b> the schedule by several weeks.</i>
<b>advancement</b>	The promotion of a person in rank or status. <i>Opportunities for career <b>advancement</b>.</i>
<b><u>ameliorate</u></b>	Make (something bad or unsatisfactory) better. <i>The reform did much to <b>ameliorate</b> living standards.</i>
<b>augment</b>	Grow or intensify. <i>The pressure <b>augmented</b>.</i>

<b>augmentation</b>	An addition to a coat of arms granted as a mark of special honour. <i>The <b>augmentation</b> of the curriculum with new subjects.</i>
<b>best</b>	To the highest degree; most (used with verbs suggesting a desirable action or state or a successful outcome). <i>The <b>best</b> film of the year.</i>
<b>better</b>	The better one that which is better. <i>His ideas for <b>bettering</b> the lot of the millhands.</i>
<b>choice</b>	An act of choosing between two or more possibilities. <i>You can have a sofa made in a <b>choice</b> of forty fabrics.</i>
<b>develop</b>	Cause to grow and differentiate in ways conforming to its natural development. <i>We must <b>develop</b> more potential customers.</i>
<b>enhance</b>	Increase. <i>This sauce will <b>enhance</b> the flavor of the meat.</i>
<b>enhancement</b>	An improvement that makes something more agreeable. <i>The <b>enhancement</b> of civic amenities.</i>
<u><b>enlarge</b></u>	Develop a larger print of (a photograph). <i>They have renovated and <b>enlarged</b> the four storey building.</i>
<u><b>enrich</b></u>	Increase the proportion of a particular isotope in (an element), especially that of the isotope U-235 in uranium so as to make it suitable for use in a nuclear reactor or weapon. <i>Her exposure to museums <b>enriched</b> her life in France.</i>
<u><b>escalate</b></u>	Make or become more intense or serious. <i>The Allies <b>escalated</b> the bombing.</i>
<b>evolve</b>	(with reference to an organism or biological feature) develop over successive generations as a result of natural selection. <i>Each school must <b>evolve</b> its own way of working.</i>
<b>expansion</b>	The increase in the volume of fuel on combustion in the cylinder of an engine, or the piston stroke in which this occurs. <i>German <b>expansion</b> in the 1930s.</i>
<b>heighten</b>	Increase. <i>The tension <b>heightened</b>.</i>
<b>improve</b>	To make better. <i>Efforts to <b>improve</b> relations between the countries.</i>
<b>improving</b>	Giving moral or intellectual benefit. <i>A large <b>improving</b> picture hung opposite.</i>
<b>increase</b>	The amount by which something increases. <i>The amount of work <b>increased</b>.</i>

<b>increment</b>	A regular increase in salary on an incremental scale. <i>All sizes from 4 30 mm in 1 mm <b>increments</b>.</i>
<b>meliorate</b>	Get better.
<u><b>optimum</b></u>	Most favorable conditions or greatest degree or amount possible under given circumstances. <i>The <b>optimum</b> must lie between these two values.</i>
<u><b>preferable</b></u>	More desirable or suitable. <i>Lower interest rates were <b>preferable</b> to higher ones.</i>
<b>reelect</b>	Elect again.
<b>sere</b>	(especially of vegetation) dry or withered. <i>The desert was edged with <b>sere</b> vegetation.</i>
<u><b>surge</b></u>	A powerful rush of an emotion or feeling. <i>Indignation <b>surged</b> up within her.</i>
<u><b>tenfold</b></u>	Having ten parts or elements. <i>A <b>tenfold</b> increase in the use of insecticides.</i>
<u><b>upgrade</b></u>	An act of upgrading something. <i>I ve <b>upgraded</b> my computer so I can run better software.</i>
<u><b>uplift</b></u>	Support from a garment, especially for a woman's bust. <i>Audiences will be <b>uplifted</b> by this incredible tale of fighting for your dreams.</i>
