<b>peak</b>	The pointed top of a mountain. <i>He was at his <b>peak</b> as a cricketer.</i>
<b>pinnacle</b>	The most successful point; the culmination. <i>Catapulted Einstein to the <b>pinnacle</b> of fame.</i>
<b>summit</b>	The highest level or degree attainable; the highest stage of development. <i>The dramas are considered to form one of the <b>summits</b> of world literature.</i>
<b>tip</b>	The pointed or rounded end or extremity of something slender or tapering. <i>The northern <b>tip</b> of Scotland.</i>
<b>top</b>	Covering for a hole especially a hole in the top of a container. <i>The springy turf of the <b>cliff</b>top.</i>
<b>zenith</b>	The time at which something is most powerful or successful. <i>In 1977 punk was at its <b>zenith</b>.</i>

<u><b>main</b></u>	Capable of standing syntactically alone as a complete sentence. <i>The camcorder can be run directly off the <b>mains</b>.</i>
<u><b>maximum</b></u>	A maximum permitted custodial sentence for an offence. <i>Production levels are near their <b>maximum</b>.</i>
<b>optimal</b>	Best or most favourable; optimum. <i>Seeking the <b>optimal</b> solution.</i>
<u><b>optimize</b></u>	Make the best or most effective use of (a situation or resource). <i>We manage our time so that we <b>optimize</b> our productivity.</i>
