<u>copious</u>	Large in number or quantity (especially of discourse). <i>She took copious notes.</i>
deluxe	Ostentatiously rich and superior in quality. <i>A deluxe car.</i>
gilded	Ostentatiously rich and superior in quality. <i>A painted and gilded wooden ceiling.</i>
grand	Rich and superior in quality. <i>Grand ballroom.</i>
<u>lush</u>	Tender and full of juice. <i>Lush greenery and cultivated fields.</i>

luxuriant	Produced or growing in extreme abundance. <i>Forests of dark luxuriant foliage.</i>
<u>luxurious</u>	Ostentatiously rich and superior in quality. <i>Enjoyed a luxurious suite with a crystal chandelier and thick oriental rugs.</i>
moneyed	Having an abundant supply of money or possessions of value. <i>Moneyed aristocrats.</i>
plentiful	Producing in abundance. <i>Food is plentiful.</i>
princely	Rich and superior in quality. <i>Princely accommodation.</i>
<u>profuse</u>	Produced or growing in extreme abundance. <i>They are profuse in hospitality.</i>
<u>prolific</u>	(of a plant, animal, or person) producing much fruit or foliage or many offspring. <i>The prolific rivers around Galway.</i>
prosperous	In fortunate circumstances financially; moderately rich. <i>We wish you a Merry Christmas and a prosperous New Year.</i>
rich	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. <i>The city is surrounded by rich agricultural land.</i>
<u>sumptuous</u>	Splendid and expensive-looking. <i>The banquet was a sumptuous luxurious meal.</i>
wealthy	Having an abundant supply of money or possessions of value. <i>Wealthy corporations.</i>
well off	In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.
with deep pockets	Large in quantity or size.

<u>luxurious</u>	Giving self-indulgent or sensual pleasure. <i>The island s most luxurious hotel.</i>
luxury	Luxurious or of the nature of a luxury. <i>They actually had the luxury of a whole day together.</i>
munificent	Characterized by or displaying great generosity. <i>A munificent patron of the arts.</i>
opulence	Wealth as evidenced by sumptuous living. <i>Rooms of spectacular opulence.</i>
ostentation	A gaudy outward display. <i>The office was spacious but without any trace of ostentation.</i>
<u>ostentatious</u>	Characterized by pretentious or showy display; designed to impress. <i>An ostentatious sable coat.</i>
palatial	Resembling a palace in being spacious and splendid. <i>Palatial furnishings.</i>
plenitude	A full supply. <i>The plenitude of the Pope s powers.</i>
plenteous	Plentiful. <i>A plenteous grape harvest.</i>
plentiful	Producing in abundance. <i>A plentiful year.</i>
plentitude	A full supply.
prodigal	A person who leaves home to lead a prodigal life but later makes a repentant return. <i>Prodigal habits die hard.</i>

prosperity	The state of being prosperous. <i>A long period of peace and prosperity.</i>
rich	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. <i>The rich flora and fauna of the forest.</i>
spendthrift	Recklessly wasteful. <i>Putt was a spendthrift and a heavy gambler.</i>
splurge	An ostentatious display (of effort or extravagance etc). <i>I d splurged about 2 500 on clothes.</i>
