<b>moneyed</b>	Having an abundant supply of money or possessions of value. <i><b>Moneyed</b> aristocrats.</i>
<b>plentiful</b>	Producing in abundance. <i>Food is <b>plentiful</b>.</i>
<b>princely</b>	Rich and superior in quality. <i><b>Princely</b> accommodation.</i>
<b>profuse</b>	Produced or growing in extreme abundance. <i>They are <b>profuse</b> in hospitality.</i>
<b>prolific</b>	(of a plant, animal, or person) producing much fruit or foliage or many offspring. <i>The <b>prolific</b> rivers around Galway.</i>
<b>prosperous</b>	In fortunate circumstances financially; moderately rich. <i>We wish you a Merry Christmas and a <b>prosperous</b> New Year.</i>
<b>rich</b>	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. <i>The city is surrounded by <b>rich</b> agricultural land.</i>
<b>sumptuous</b>	Splendid and expensive-looking. <i>The banquet was a <b>sumptuous</b> luxurious meal.</i>
<b>wealthy</b>	Having an abundant supply of money or possessions of value. <i><b>Wealthy</b> corporations.</i>
<b>well off</b>	In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.
<b>with deep pockets</b>	Large in quantity or size.

<b><u>lavish</u></b>	Spent or given in profusion. <i>Distributed gifts with a <b>lavish</b> hand.</i>
<b>luxuriant</b>	Displaying luxury and furnishing gratification to the senses. <i>Forests of dark <b>luxuriant</b> foliage.</i>
<b><u>luxurious</u></b>	Giving self-indulgent or sensual pleasure. <i>The island s most <b>luxurious</b> hotel.</i>
<b>luxury</b>	Luxurious or of the nature of a luxury. <i>They actually had the <b>luxury</b> of a whole day together.</i>
<b>munificent</b>	Characterized by or displaying great generosity. <i>A <b>munificent</b> patron of the arts.</i>
<b>opulence</b>	Wealth as evidenced by sumptuous living. <i>Rooms of spectacular <b>opulence</b>.</i>
<b>ostentation</b>	A gaudy outward display. <i>The office was spacious but without any trace of <b>ostentation</b>.</i>
<b><u>ostentatious</u></b>	Characterized by pretentious or showy display; designed to impress. <i>An <b>ostentatious</b> sable coat.</i>
<b>palatial</b>	Resembling a palace in being spacious and splendid. <i><b>Palatial</b> furnishings.</i>
<b>plenitude</b>	A full supply. <i>The <b>plenitude</b> of the Pope s powers.</i>
<b>plenteous</b>	Plentiful. <i>A <b>plenteous</b> grape harvest.</i>

<b>plentitude</b>	A full supply.

- spendthrift** Recklessly wasteful.

- splurge** An ostentatious display (of effort or extravagance etc).  
*I d **splurged** about 2 500 on clothes.*
- sumptuous** Ostentatiously rich and superior in quality.  
*The banquet was a **sumptuous** luxurious meal.*
- upscale** Convert (an image or video) so that it displays correctly in a higher resolution format.  
*An **upscale** neighborhood.*
