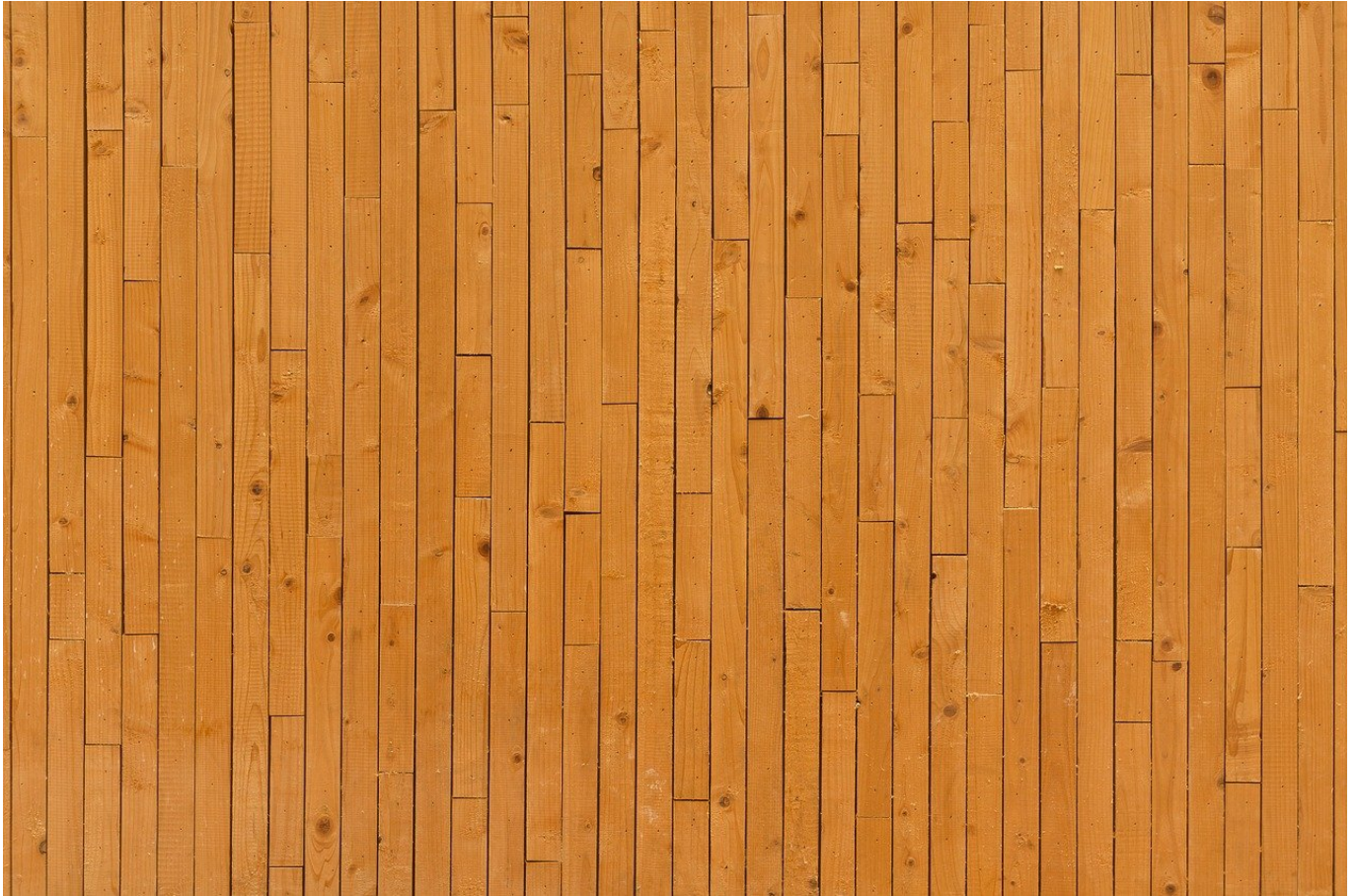
## Orange as a Noun

### Definitions of "Orange" as a noun

- *Any pigment producing the orange color.*
- *A drink made from or flavoured with oranges.*
- *A large round juicy citrus fruit with a tough bright reddish-yellow rind.*
- *Round yellow to orange fruit of any of several citrus trees.*
- *The leathery-leaved evergreen tree that bears the orange, native to warm regions of South and SE Asia. Oranges are a major commercial crop in many warm regions of the world.*
- *Orange color or pigment; any of a range of colors between red and yellow.*
- *Used in names of plants with similar fruit or flowers to the orange tree, e.g. mock orange.*
- *A river in South Africa that flows generally westward to the Atlantic Ocean.*
- *A butterfly with mainly or partly orange wings.*
- *A bright reddish-yellow colour like that of the skin of a ripe orange.*

- *Any citrus tree bearing oranges.*

- coconut** The flesh of a coconut often used as food.

<b>dye</b>	Color with dye. Please <b>dye</b> these shoes.
<b>grapevine</b>	Gossip spread by spoken communication. I d heard on the <b>grapevine</b> that the business was nearly settled.
<b>gray</b>	English radiobiologist in whose honor the gray the SI unit of energy for the absorbed dose of radiation was named 1905 1965. <b>Gray</b> flannel suit.
<b>juice</b>	Extract the juice from fruit or vegetables. Her creative <b>juices</b> were flowing.
<b>juicy</b>	Full of juice. <b>Juicy</b> gossip.
<b>lemon</b>	A drink made from or flavoured with lemon juice. A <b>lemon</b> T shirt.
<b>marbled</b>	(especially of paper) having a streaked and patterned appearance like that of variegated marble. Attractively <b>marbled</b> cloth or paper.
<b>marmalade</b>	A preserve made from citrus fruit, especially bitter oranges.
<b>painted</b>	Wearing make-up or cosmetics. A brightly <b>painted</b> caravan.
<b>peach</b>	The Chinese tree that bears peaches. The sky began to change from grey to <b>peach</b> .
<b>pear</b>	The Eurasian tree which bears the pear.
<b>persimmon</b>	The tree which yields the persimmon related to ebony.
<b>pigmentation</b>	Abnormal colouring of a person's skin, typically resulting from disease.
<b>polychrome</b>	Color with many colors make polychrome. A precious <b>polychrome</b> ikon.
<b>red</b>	A red light. Small declines in revenue can soon send an airline plunging into the <b>red</b> .
<b>rind</b>	The skin or blubber of a whale. Olive oil infused with lemon <b>rinds</b> .
<b>scarlet</b>	Scarlet clothes or material. Silk awnings of brilliant <b>scarlet</b> .
<b>spotted</b>	Marked or decorated with spots. A black and white <b>spotted</b> cow.



- strawberry** The low growing plant which produces the strawberry having white flowers lobed leaves and runners and found throughout north temperate regions.  
*She thought she would wear the **strawberry** crushed velvet.*
- stripe** Mark with stripes.  
*A green toad with small black **stripes** or bars.*
- striped** Marked with or having stripes.  
*A green **striped** coat.*
- tangerine** The citrus tree which bears the tangerine.  
*A **tangerine** evening gown.*
- yellow** Used in names of moths or butterflies that are mainly yellow in colour.  
***Yellowed** parchment.*
