### Definitions of "Ordeal" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “ordeal” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A primitive method of determining a person's guilt or innocence by subjecting the accused person to dangerous or painful tests believed to be under divine control; escape was usually taken as a sign of innocence.*
- *An ancient test of guilt or innocence by subjection of the accused to severe pain, survival of which was taken as divine proof of innocence.*
- *A severe or trying experience.*
- *A very unpleasant and prolonged experience.*



## Synonyms of "Ordeal" as a noun (15 Words)

- agony** A state of acute pain.  
*He crashed to the ground in **agony**.*
- baptism of fire** A Christian sacrament signifying spiritual cleansing and rebirth.
- difficulty** A situation that is difficult or dangerous.

- misery** A state of ill-being due to affliction or misfortune.

*Dances were absolute **torture** because I was so small.*
- trauma** Any physical damage to the body caused by violence or accident or fracture etc.  
*A personal **trauma** like the death of a child.*
- trial** A preliminary competition to determine qualifications.  
*Candidates must compete in a **trial** of skill.*
- trial by ordeal** The determination of a person's innocence or guilt by due process of law.
- tribulation** A state of great trouble or suffering.  
*The **tribulations** of being a megastar.*
- trouble** A strong feeling of anxiety.  
*They had labor **trouble**.*

<b>blamed</b>	Expletives used informally as intensifiers. <i>It s a <b>blamed</b> shame.</i>
<u><b>dire</b></u>	(of a warning or threat) presaging disaster. <i>The concert was <b>dire</b>.</i>
<b>disservice</b>	An act intended to help that turns out badly. <i>You have done a <b>disservice</b> to the African people by ignoring this fact.</i>
<u><b>dread</b></u>	Causing fear or dread or terror. <i>The <b>dread</b> presence of the headmaster.</i>
<u><b>dreadful</b></u>	Used to emphasize the degree to which something is the case, especially something regarded with sadness or disapproval. <i>A <b>dreadful</b> storm.</i>
<b>fearful</b>	Lacking courage; ignobly timid and faint-hearted- P.B.Shelley. <i><b>Fearful</b> of criticism.</i>
<b>fearsome</b>	Causing fear or dread or terror. <i>The cat mewed displaying a <b>fearsome</b> set of teeth.</i>
<u><b>formidable</b></u>	Inspiring fear or respect through being impressively large, powerful, intense, or capable. <i>The <b>formidable</b> army of brains at the Prime Minister s disposal.</i>
<u><b>frightening</b></u>	Causing fear or dread or terror. <i>A <b>frightening</b> experience.</i>

<b>frightful</b>	Extreme in degree or extent or amount or impact. <i>A <b>frightful</b> mistake.</i>
<b><u>ghastly</u></b>	Causing great horror or fear. <i>A <b>ghastly</b> pallor.</i>
<b><u>hellish</u></b>	Extremely (used for emphasis). <i><b>Hellish</b> torture.</i>
<b>horrible</b>	Causing or likely to cause horror; shocking. <i>War is beyond all words <b>horrible</b>.</i>
<b><u>horrific</u></b>	Causing horror. <i><b>Horrific</b> conditions in the mining industry.</i>
<b><u>nasty</u></b>	Offensive or even (of persons) malicious. <i>Plastic bags burn with a <b>nasty</b> acrid smell.</i>
<b>probe</b>	Examine physically with or as if with a probe. <i>There was a congressional <b>probe</b> into the scandal.</i>
<b>sadly</b>	To a regrettable extent; regrettably. <i><b>Sadly</b> the forests of Sulawesi are now under threat.</i>
<b>terrible</b>	Exceptionally bad or displeasing. <i>The <b>terrible</b> conditions in which the ordinary people lived.</i>
<b><u>terrifying</u></b>	Causing extreme terror. <i>The <b>terrifying</b> events of the past few weeks.</i>
<b>test</b>	Carry out a medical test on a person a part of the body or a body fluid. <i>The exam will <b>test</b> accuracy and neatness.</i>
<b><u>tragedy</u></b>	The dramatic genre represented by tragedies. <i>Greek <b>tragedy</b>.</i>
<b><u>trial</u></b>	Of a horse dog or other animal compete in trials. <i>Clinical <b>trials</b> must establish whether the new hip replacements are working.</i>
<b><u>unspeakable</u></b>	Not able to be expressed in words. <i>A piece of <b>unspeakable</b> abuse.</i>
