- *Determine one's position with reference to another point.*
- *Adjust to a specific need or market.*
- *Cause to point.*
- *Tailor or adapt (something) to specified circumstances.*
- *Guide (someone) in a specified direction.*
- *Align or position (something) relative to the points of a compass or other specified positions.*
- *Find one's position in relation to unfamiliar surroundings.*
- *Be oriented.*

- *Familiarize (someone) with new surroundings or circumstances.*

aim

Specifically design a product, event, or activity for a certain public.
*She wanted to **aim** a pun.*

align

Align oneself with a group or a way of thinking.
*The fan blades are carefully **aligned**.*

angle

Direct or incline at an angle.
*He **angled** his way into the room.*

design

Make a design of plan out in systematic often graphic form.
*She **designed** a good excuse for not attending classes that day.*

direct

Aim something in a particular direction or at a particular person.
*He **directed** the children to do their homework.*

dispose	Kill. <i>The Scottish champions were buoyant after they disposed of English champions Leeds.</i>
establish one's location	Use as a basis for; found on.
feel one's way	Grope or feel in search of something.
find one's bearings	Come upon after searching; find the location of something that was missed or lost.
get one's bearings	Communicate with a place or person; establish communication with, as if by telephone.
get the lie of the land	Cause to do; cause to act in a specified manner.
<u>intend</u>	Mean or intend to express or convey. <i>It was not intended that colleges should have to revise their current schemes.</i>
orientate	Familiarize (someone) with new surroundings or circumstances.
<u>pitch</u>	Set one's voice or a piece of music at a particular pitch. <i>A Land Rover came pitching round the hillside.</i>
place	Score a goal by a place kick. <i>Enemy officers were placed under arrest.</i>
point	Insert points in written text of Semitic languages. <i>A sign pointing left.</i>
position	Put into a certain place or abstract location. <i>I had positioned her as my antagonist.</i>
put	Put into a certain place or abstract location. <i>He was put in charge of civil defence.</i>
set	Put or set seeds seedlings or plants into the ground. <i>Set a broken bone.</i>
situate	Fix or build (something) in a certain place or position. <i>Amy is now comfortably situated.</i>
<u>slant</u>	To incline or bend from a vertical position. <i>The early sun slanted across the mountains.</i>
<u>steer</u>	Be a guiding or motivating force or drive. <i>The teacher steered the gifted students towards the more challenging courses.</i>
tailor	Of a tailor make clothes to fit individual customers. <i>Tailor your needs to your surroundings.</i>

- *A magazine oriented towards young people.*
- *We were oriented towards the building.*
- *The dean of students tries to orient the freshmen.*
- *There were no street names to enable her to orient herself.*
- *Magazines oriented to the business community.*
- *Market-oriented economic reforms.*
- *The fires are oriented in direct line with the midsummer sunset.*
- *We had to orient ourselves in the forest.*

boreal

Relating to or denoting the second climatic stage of the postglacial period in northern Europe between the Preboreal and Atlantic stages about 9 000 to 7 500 years ago marked by a warm dry climate.
*Northern **boreal** forest.*

continent

Any of the world's main continuous expanses of land (Europe, Asia, Africa, North and South America, Australia, Antarctica).
*There are seven **continents**.*

cosmogony

A theory regarding the origin of the universe.
*In their **cosmogony** the world was thought to be a square flat surface.*

direction

Something that provides direction or advice as to a decision or course of action.
*A house with views in all **directions**.*

earth	A connection between an electrical device and a large conducting body such as the earth which is taken to be at zero voltage. <i>God s will be done on earth as it is in heaven.</i>
east	The former communist states of eastern Europe. <i>The river rises east of Brentford.</i>
eastern	Relating to or characteristic of regions of eastern parts of the world. <i>An eastern wind.</i>
europe	An international organization of European countries formed after World War II to reduce trade barriers and increase cooperation among its members.
global	Having the shape of a sphere or ball- Zane Grey. <i>Give students a global picture of what is involved in the task.</i>
globe	Form something into a globe. <i>Orange trees clipped into giant globes.</i>
history	The continuum of events occurring in succession leading from the past to the present and even into the future. <i>A history of France.</i>
intercontinental	Extending or taking place between or among continents. <i>Intercontinental exploration.</i>
locate	Take up residence and become established. <i>The company located some of their agents in Los Angeles.</i>
location	The action of locating someone or something. <i>They shot the film on location in Nevada.</i>
north	The northern part of England. <i>The north bank of the river.</i>
occident	The countries of (originally) Europe and (now including) North America and South America.
occidental	A native or inhabitant of the West. <i>Occidental civilization.</i>
oriental	(of a pearl or other jewel) orient. <i>Oriental countries.</i>
south	Move towards the south. <i>The village is a few miles south of Cambridge.</i>
southeast	The direction corresponding to the southeastward compass point. <i>Southeasterly breezes.</i>

southern	In or characteristic of a region of the United States south of (approximately) the Mason-Dixon line. <i>Southern</i> cooking.
southwest	To toward or in the southwest. <i>The winds are southwesterly.</i>
transnational	Extending or operating across national boundaries. <i>Transnational</i> advertising agencies.
<u>universal</u>	A thing having universal effect currency or application. <i>In motor vehicles a universal joint allows the driveshaft to move up and down as the vehicle passes over bumps.</i>
<u>universe</u>	All existing matter and space considered as a whole the cosmos The universe is believed to be at least 10 billion light years in diameter and contains a vast number of galaxies it has been expanding since its creation in the Big Bang about 13 billion years ago. <i>The front parlour was the hub of her universe.</i>
west	A location in the western part of a country region or city. <i>It will become windy in the west.</i>
western	A sandwich made from a western omelet. <i>Western</i> thought.
world	A particular period of history. <i>The outdoor world.</i>
<u>worldwide</u>	Of worldwide scope or applicability. A <i>worldwide</i> epidemic.
